# SUCCESS STORY-Dirksen School in National Spotlight for Literacy

The national Partnership in Comprehensive Literacy (PCL) and Comprehensive Intervention Model (CIM) network is comprised of university and public school partnerships across 13 states. Comprehensive Literacy districts within these states commit to joining together electronically using ZOOM technology for monthly continuing professional development, supporting the belief that teacher expertise is the strongest variable impacting student progress. During each monthly continuing professional development session, over 200 participants across the nation observe intervention lessons and reflect on student learning and response to instruction. It is critical that videotaped lessons are used during each professional development session as these lessons present participants the opportunity to observe authentic instruction and to problem solve teaching and learning issues.

In November and January of FY18 Dirksen Comprehensive Intervention Specialists, Jennifer Linehan and Jennifer Tucker provided literacy intervention lessons for over 200 individuals participating in Comprehensive Literacy Learning. These specialists have generously shared their expertise by representing the superlative teaching and collaboration we have within the Pekin Comprehensive Literacy Model. This expertise was shared through numerous videotaped lessons used as model teaching for the national Comprehensive Literacy Learning Network. Jennifer Harris and the Dirksen literacy team have also provided several hours of videotaped sessions modeling how coaches, interventionists, and classroom teachers collaborate to achieve instructional unity for Dirksen students. Principal Melissa Lard continues to support the work of coaches, interventionists, and classroom teachers, allowing Dirksen to be spotlighted across the nation.

Congratulations to the Dirksen team for positively representing the Pekin Comprehensive Literacy Model and setting high standards for educational systems across the Comprehensive Literacy Learning Network.
