Message from Heather Tate, School Counselor

Trustworthiness

This month we have been focusing on the character trait of trustworthiness. Our discussions have focused on what makes a trustworthy friend and how powerful words can be. To guide the discussion, we read the book, "Mr. Peabody's Apples" by Madonna. The book tells the story of Mr. Peabody, a well-loved teacher, coach, and community member who had his reputation put in jeopardy when a child mistakenly thought that Mr. Peabody had stolen an apple. Instead of talking with Mr. Peabody to understand what he had seen, the student told his friends, who then told their parents, who then told their friends, that Mr. Peabody was a thief. People in town started treating Mr. Peabody differently all because of a misunderstanding. The story helps us to understand the power of our words, and that once words have been spoken you can't take them back. We can apologize for what we have said or done, but it can never be undone. Our words and our actions have an impact on other's lives and how people view us. In order to be a trustworthy friend, we need to be sure that what we are saying is truthful, helpful, and kind.

Trustworthiness is about keeping promises, telling the truth, being dependable, and living a life that others respect. You can support your children in developing this trait by doing the following:

- Make trustworthiness an expectation within the family and discuss the importance of being trustworthy.
- Deal with disagreements in an open and honest way; communicating appropriately.
- Monitor our behavior making sure we keep our promises and follow through.
- Be honest with your words and actions .
- Have clear, consistent consequences when your children are dishonest in their words and behavior.
- When watching TV, reading literature, or watching a movie discuss with your children scenes that show dishonesty or honesty.
- Use language that helps the children connect their behavior to the trait you are teaching.

Questions to discuss with your children:

- How do you feel when somebody isn't being honest with you?
- Why do you think it is important to be trustworthy?
- What consequences should be in place if someone is dishonest?
- If someone is not being honest with you, what should you do?
- How do you build trust with someone?
- Who do you trust and why?







PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Typical Peer Registration Information

Preschool Registration for the 2019-2020 school year will take place at the Beavercreek Preschool Center **March 4th - 8th between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.** We are located at 3038 Kemp Road. Visitors must park in the north lot off Hanes Rd.

You do not need to bring any supporting documentation at the time of registration. If your child is selected in the lottery, you will be notified in April. At this time, you will need to provide the required documentation for enrollment.

REQUIREMENTS FOR TYPICAL PEERS

- •Parent must be a resident of Beavercreek.
- •Children must be 3 years of age by August 1, 2019, completely potty trained, and demonstrate clear verbal skills and positive social skills.
- •Parents are responsible for providing transportation to and from school.

Typical tuition paying peers serve as role models for children with developmental delays enrolled in the program. Spaces are limited and students will be selected according to age and needs of the program through a lottery basis. Placement will be assigned at either of the preschool sites, Beavercreek Preschool Center or Parkwood Elementary, based on the needs of the program. Upon notification of placement, a non-refundable \$75.00 deposit will be due. Typical Peer Tuition for 2019-2020 school year: \$350.00 per quarter, plus School fees of \$37.50 per year.

**Students on IEPs do not pay tuition according to Federal IDEIA right to a free and appropriate public education experience. School fees of \$37.50 still apply.

What is Character Ed?

The first Wednesday of each month is Character Ed Day. We ask that each student wear their grade level shirt (the one with their graduation year on the back) or a shirt their grade level color.

It is not required, but is a part of a program run by Mrs. Tate, our school counselor. She uses these Wednesdays to help our students build character by introducing lessons that focusing on trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship.

The class color will be the same for all of a student's years at Trebein. When the fifth graders move on to middle school their color becomes the next kindergarten class' color. While the program is run by Mrs. Tate the shirts are ordered through the PTO. We will usually order at the beginning and end of each year giving the kindergarteners a chance to get their shirts and others a chance to replace shirts that are worn out or too small. The colors are:

> K = Blue3rd = Purple 1st = Red4th = Green 2nd = Orange $5^{th} = Yellow$

Teachers also sometimes ask that the shirts be worn for field trips or other events because it's an easy way to identify our students and show a little school spirit! ©
