

This year's Character Education Service Project is: UpLIFT: Support, Serve, Celebrate.

We have two main goals of our service project this year. The first goal is to focus on uplifting each other at Trebein. This will include taking time to support each other and to celebrate our accomplishments and our differences.

The second goal of this year's UpLIFT service project is to uplift a community organization. Each school building has been tasked with selecting a community organization that they would like to support, serve and celebrate. Trebein has chosen to uplift One Bistro (located in Xenia) which strives to serve a healthy, affordable meal to neighbors, both those who have the ability to pay and those who under normal circumstances would not be able to pay. The mission of One Bistro is to provide a place where neighbors eat and come together as one community. They embrace a "pay what you can afford" concept and work to eliminate hunger, grow relationships, and celebrate community.

Our goal for the school year is to be able to provide at least 3 community meals with our support. This would amount to 180-300 meals that One Bistro would be able to provide to the hungry with the support of Trebein families. Quick facts about a pesky topic: Lice

- 1 Mainly spreads by direct head-to-head contact, making it more common in the younger age groups since they are less aware of personal space.
- 2 It tends to be more prominent with girls not necessarily because of the longer hair, but the sharing of brushes and hair supplies.
- 3 Common places of transmission include: slumber parties, birthday parties, within a family setting, through group activities/sports, camps, mass transit (buses), and yes-classrooms. While teachers work diligently at teaching young ones personal space and not laying your body all over other people, it is a tough concept for the youngest of our student body.
- 4 Lice do not jump or fly, and is not a sign of poor hygiene. As gross as it may make anyone feel, lice are simply opportunistic organisms that will infest whomever they can.
- 5 It can take up to 4 weeks for a lice infestation to be noticed. While itching is the most common symptom (many have no symptoms at all), this may take a long time to occur making it more problematic. We recommend going through your child's hair weekly (for example, every Friday evening before bed) to help prevent and control the spread of this, if suspected.

The district practices a "no live lice" policy; meaning if lice is suspected, and found on a student, they will need to be picked up and receive treatment before returning to school. Letters will be sent home in the classroom(s) as a prompt to check, report, and prevent any further spread. If you have any specific questions about this topic, don't hesitate to contact the school nurse.

Say BOO to the Flu!

Influenza is a respiratory virus (not a stomach bug), and is NOT the same as the common cold (see chart below). Best prevention methods include *getting your flu vaccine*, diligent hand washing, and appropriate cough/sneeze etiquette (in the bend of the elbow).

What IS Character Ed?

The first Wednesday of each month is Character Ed Day. We ask that each student wear their grade level shirt (the one with their graduation year on the back) or a shirt their grade level color.

It is not required, but is a part of a program run by Mrs. Tate, our school counselor. She uses these Wednesdays to help our students build character by introducing lessons that focusing on trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship.

The class color will be the same for all of a student's years at Trebein. When the fifth graders move on to middle school their color becomes the next kindergarten class' color. The colors are:

K = Blue $3^{rd} = Purple$ $1^{st} = Red$ $4^{th} = Green$ $2^{nd} = Orange$ $5^{th} = Yellow$

Teachers also sometimes ask that the shirts be worn for field trips or other events because it's an easy way to identify our students and show a little school spirit! ©
