Joint Board Meeting – Schedule with Frederick March 22, 23 or 24th.

Spring Sports: Track started Monday, 24 students attended. The first meet is schedule for March 29th. 20 Students signed up for golf, might need additional help. Discussed hosting a meet as only 3 are scheduled thus far.

Trap shooting was brought up, but the club was interfering a bit with the 4-H season and the volunteer has since moved away.

Maintenance & Building Items:

Pursuing Electrical – Spoke with an attorney from Pierre and are waiting to hear back.

Fuel Tank – The censor went out and would cost around \$2,500 to get a new one. For now, Dana will check monthly with the reading stick.

House of Glass Quote: Received a quote to update the windows so each new classroom and office has one that opens. The quote also included redoing a window in 3rd grade and the shop to accommodate for air conditioning units. Looking to get another quote for the shop garage door replacement.

*Motion 20-114 by Zantow/Wollman to approve the House of Glass quote for window improvements contingent upon receiving ESSER II Funds. Motion Carried.

Capital Outlay Projects

Gym Floor: Derksen Flooring will be here on Friday to measure for an estimate to sand it down and refinish.

Basketball Hoops: Discussed getting new basketball hoops and hardware, but decided it was too expensive.

Football Field Lights: Sieh received donations from various businesses in the amount of \$10,500. The City sent over a check for \$5,000 to help with labor and new wire costs.

*Motion 20-115 by Spitzer/Wollman to purchase the new lights for the field. Motion Carried.

*Motion 20-116 by Zantow/Wollman to purchase new goal posts for the football field for \$5,895.00 contingent on receiving ESSER II funds. Motion Carried.

Track: Received the quote do redo the track.

*Motion 20-117 by Westphal/Zantow to hire Jensen Rock and Sand to resurface the track for \$8,610.00, but would like them to come look at it with the Building & Grounds Committee to make sure it won't cost more. Motion Carried.

Bus:

*Motion 20-118 by Zantow/Wollman to purchase a 71 passenger diesel bus with bottom storage, but would like to check Sourcewell for pricing. Motion Carried.

Principal/Superintendent Items:

Legislative Update: After legislation passed, the school will need to update the home school policy.

Testing Update: ACCESS testing is done and will be doing Smarter Balance testing soon. Science will be tested on, but will not count for accountability.

Discussed doing NWEA testing next school year as well.

Open Gym and Fitness Center: The board would like students to have more access to the facilities to work on sports.

Myer would like to do a summer activity calendar. She reported that Chandler Ellwein would like to do a workout program under Mr. Flemmer's supervision. Sieh reported she will be doing a Basketball camp in Leola on July 27-29th.
