# 3. Covid-19 Update

#### Covid-19 numbers for RSU 50

The current numbers for RSU 50 remain relatively low. We have had three weeks in a row of pooled testing with no positive pools being detected. The students and staff continue to be respectful of parents/staff/student choice with mask wearing. A low number of substitute's continues to be a problem for staff impacted by Covid-19 and other absences. We are making it work, but all staff have been asked to help with student coverage. We are very fortunate to have an excellent group of professionals to work with our students.

#### **Pooled Testing:**

The epidemiology of the BA.2. variant of COVID-19 reduces the effectiveness of pooled testing as a method for early detection of COVID-19 in schools and, thus, as a means to reduce transmission within schools. This is because of the BA.2 variant's significantly greater contagiousness compared to the Omicron strain from January 2022. The greater contagiousness means that the likelihood of detecting, identifying, and isolating an individual with COVID-19 from pooled testing *before* that individual has spread the virus to others is significantly reduced. Instead, frequent at-home testing is more protective than pooled testing. To ensure this is a viable option, Maine DOE/CDC strongly encourage SAUs to order at-home test kits. As announced earlier this week, they will be provided free of charge for SAUs to distribute to staff and students.

Moving forward, Maine CDC will make a statewide decision on when pooled testing will be phased out, rather than expecting each SAU to do so independently. The Maine CDC will craft and release a message that clarifies why this is epidemiologically the best decision, and they have asked for unified support from our education organizations, which has been confirmed. We anticipate this announcement being released this week.

#### **Standard Operating Procedure(SOP):**

The SOP is running its course, and barring any unforeseen issues, will be retired at the end of the school year. School nurses will receive technical assistance as they transition to the standard response protocols for infectious diseases.

#### Maine DHHS allotment of at-home Covid-19 tests

Maine DHHS, with the support of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, will provide schools with a one-time allotment of at-home COVID-19 rapid antigen test kits to distribute to students and staff. These tests include the Siemens CLINITEST Rapid COVID-19 Antigen Self-Test, Abbott BinaxNOW Self-tests, or OraSure InteliSwab rapid tests. While school administrative units (SAUs) and schools will not have a choice in the brand of test they will receive, enough will be distributed to supply each individual student and staff person with 5 or 6 individually wrapped at-home rapid antigen tests. The purpose of this new testing option is to provide staff and

families with at-home COVID-19 tests for individuals who are close contacts, or have symptoms, to prevent those individuals from unknowingly spreading this highly contagious disease while at school. These tests may be distributed by schools this spring, summer, or fall.

All Maine PreK to 12 students and staff are eligible to receive at-home rapid antigen test kits through their schools. SAUs and private schools may order up to one kit for each student and staff member. Each kit consists of either one box of five tests or three boxes of two individually wrapped tests. This program is voluntary and SAUs and private schools may wish to assess interest in participation prior to ordering. Any tests not distributed upon receipt should be stored in a secure location and kept at room temperature (40 to 80 degrees Fahrenheit). Tests will have a shelf life of 8 to 12 months. Tests may be distributed to students and staff at the school's or SAU's discretion. RSU 50 has ordered tests for all students and staff, 450 kits. They should be delivered to our school by June 2022.
