

Dear Parents,

It is time to register for the Newell Community Club Summer Swimming Program! The Newell group is scheduled for a two week session July 12th-22nd with lessons on Monday thru Thursday at 11:00 a.m. to 11:50 a.m. A chaperoned bus will pick up kids at Newell MS at 10:15 a.m. and return at 12:55 a.m. The bus will also stop to pick up kids at the Nisland Mall at 10:20 a.m. and drop off there at 12:40 p.m.

Heather McCann and another volunteer chaperone will accompany the Newell group to swimming lessons each day. Please text or call Heather at 605-580-1797 (cell) if your child will not be riding the bus or will be picked up at the Community Center as well as if you have any questions, concerns, or problems.

Kids in the Quackers 3-4 year old group must have a parent/guardian with them on the bus and poolside (not in the water).

This year the cost of swimming lessons this year is \$39.00 per child. Sign and return a registration form along with a payment of \$39.00 for **each child** participating to the Elem/MS office by May 27, 2021. Please make checks payable to the **NEWELL COMMUNITY CLUB**.

There will be open swim on Tuesdays from 1:00 – 3:30 p.m. The cost for this is not included in the price for the swimming lessons. The cost is \$2.75 per time. Transportation is not provided for this option. The bus will leave after swimming lessons are finished and if the students wish to stay for this, the parents must provide transportation home.

I have included a copy of the 2019 swim levels completed for students with this letter.

One chaperone will be needed for each lesson each day. Please contact me at 456-0102 if you will be able to help out as a chaperone.

Please thank the Newell Community Club for providing this opportunity, the Newell School for providing the bus and fuel, and the Prairie Pals 4H club for their donation to help keep the cost of the swimming lessons more reasonable for the families.
