Alaska partners with Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) to administer the Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools, or PEAKS. The assessment measures students' understanding of the Alaska English Language Arts & Mathematics standards adopted in 2012. The PEAKS assessment is administered to students in grades 3-9.

Some things you can do as a parent to make testing successful are:

Sleep: Make sure your child gets a good night's rest for each day of testing.

Breakfast: There is scientific data that says a child that eats a good breakfast can focus and retain knowledge. The School District will have snacks available during testing times.

Concentration: Make sure your student comes to school ready to do their best on tests. Encourage them to take their time and do their best.

Remember, it is not a race. There is no time limit so students can continue to do their best work.
