# **Project Hope**

The 2017 holiday season brought with it another successful Christmas project for Project HOPE! Project HOPE is a charitable organization run by Bangor Township Schools' staff with the goal of providing essentials for the students, staff, and families of Bangor Township during times of unforeseen crisis or need.

During the Christmas project, the staff and students of Bangor Township, along with some community members, support children of families who have been selected based on financial need or hardship. Once a family is selected, a list of eight items is developed for each child in the family, aiming to keep the amount spent around \$100. The list contains a pair of pants, a shirt, a sweatshirt/hoodie, a book or a board game, and shoes or boots. The remaining items are usually toys or specific requests the child might need, like pajamas, bedding, or personal care items. Families are "adopted" by classrooms at John Glenn and CMMS, as well as by current staff members, or even families within Bangor, and then those individuals purchase items from the list. Unfulfilled items are then purchased by Project HOPE using money from our fundraising. Finally, gifts are delivered to the families' home schools for pick up by the parents. This year we provided wrapping paper and tape for familes as well!

In the 2017 season, 39 families were adopted, and 100 Bangor Township children benefited from the project! This equates to upwards of 800 presents being purchased!

In addition to the Christmas project, Project HOPE also helps individuals or families deal with fires, death or extreme illness, unforeseen tragedy, or lack of essentials, such as food or personal care items. This is a year-round effort to help the people of Bangor Township Schools!






### **Cheer Clinic**












# **Family Sweetheart Dance**
