## Knowing Your Science



Charlie Jones, a former science - Ag teacher spoke to eager 7th graders about "knowing your science". Through storytelling and laughter, Mr. Jones' presentation took the students through plants and their adaptations, how to know soil type based on vegetation, rock types, aquifers and watersheds. He demonstrated how oil could be removed from limestone and the importance of how all these things tie in together. Using an apple, Mr. Jones illustrated how the Earth's small portion of farm and ranch land is all we have and the importance of knowing the needs of the land and caring for it. With much laughter, the students were able to hear a farmer's point of view of what Earth means. Charlie Jones is the grandfather of 7th grader Colt Nelson.

As a side note, Mr. Jones taught one of our former coaches in Throckmorton, Texas. Mr. Jones knew he was still in Gunter, and asked to see him because he wanted to show him something.
