

TIGERS IN THE SNOW

So many memories were made in the UNPRECEDENTED "Snowmageddon" event! Whether they were good, bad, fun, or you were just in survival mode, we know you will not forget the week of February 14, 2021!





Remember December 5, 2013? It was what we called ice-mageddon... and those 5 days of bad weather can't even touch what we experienced with the winter storm this year (named Uri by The Weather Channel).

"Uri" rolled into our area on the evening of Sunday, February 14, 2021, blanketed our area with several inches of snow and kept the temperatures in the negative to single digit range for 5 solid days and nights. On Friday, February 20th, we saw the first break in the temperatures when we reached over 32°.

With freezing temperatures comes many problems for Texans. While our state infrastructure is prepared for temperatures to go above 100 degrees in the

summer, it was not prepared for 5 days of frigid temps. The plan was for rolling electrical outages to take place across the state... not ideal, but better than nothing. The rolling outage began, but never came back on for many Gunter residents. They either spent up to 5 days without heat and water, or they packed up and left their house not knowing what they would return to; including frozen pipes, flooded homes, frozen swimming pools, and more.

Unfortunately, our school buildings didn't fare so well in this storm. We had several broken water pipes, major flooding in two buildings, and a gas line break. Gunter ISD will repair the damage, and bounce back just like we always do!









