## 2021-2022 Pre-K and Kindergarten Roundup

Registration for the 2021-2022 school year will be held on Monday, April 5th from 4:00-6:30pm in the elementary school cafeteria. This is only for incoming Pre K and Kindergarten students that are new to the district.

Parents should bring the child's birth certificate, social security card, immunization record, photo ID of enroller, and proof of residency.
For Pre-K, you may qualify based on meeting the eligibility criteria listed below or you may attend for a monthly fee of $\$ 440$, based on availability.

- Qualifying factors are as follows:
- child is limited English speaking
- child is homeless
- child is or has ever been in the foster care system
- child is a dependent of active or deceased military
- child's parent is a recipient of Star of Texas Award

- family meets income threshold (must provide two months of pay stubs)

Students will not be reserved a place in Pre-K until the school has received ALL required documents. For non-qualifying students, there is a $\$ 75$ registration fee due to hold a spot.

Dear GISD Family - I wanted to share with you the decisions from the Board Meeting this evening. Please know that our Leadership Team and School Board gave careful consideration to various data and feedback around this issue including:

- GISD's Covid Data History (printed on page 4 of this newsletter) - which has shown very few cases in the last several months as well as a very high number of students who have missed multiple weeks of school due to close contact;
- GISD's Covid Protocol Survey Data from both our staff and our parents - which both were mass majority in favor of lifting mask requirements and limiting some of the required close contact quarantines; and
- The opportunity for all of our GISD staff to receive the Covid vaccine - 52 staff members are already fully vaccinated or have already received their first shot and the remainder will have an opportunity this Friday.

Below is the general summary of the changes that were approved unanimously this evening by our Board of Trustees:

## COVID PROTOCOL CHANGES

1. Face Coverings - As of March 15, 2021, face coverings are optional for students, staff and visitors in district facilities, school buses and school events. We would encourage students \& staff to take whatever precautions they feel comfortable with in light of Covid. Please note, however, that if the number of cases in GISD increase past a certain threshold (greater than 5\%), face coverings may be required on a certain campus or a specific grade level until the \# of cases falls below that threshold per our Multi-Stage Approach guidelines. *To date, this threshold has not been met.
2. Close Contact - Close Contact mandatory quarantine requirements will only be in effect for students and staff who have had "significant \& sustained contact" - (ie, household member, traveling together, significant contact in activities, sleepovers, etc.). All other "close contacts" will be communicated to parents and parents may choose whether to quarantine.
3. Staff Leave - Staff will continue to have access to Local Covid Leave through the duration of Spring 2021, though we are encouraging those who choose not to receive a vaccination to wear a face covering when in close contact with others.
4. Notifications - Covid notifications will solely be communicated through our Covid Tracker which is updated daily if there are any new cases.
5. Capacity - GISD will allow $100 \%$ capacity at outdoor events and $75 \%$ capacity at indoor events but we will still minimize mass indoor gatherings (ie, pep rally / end of year awards ceremonies).
6. Field Trips - Daytime field trips will now be allowed. *Required protocols may vary per site.
7. Overnight Trips - Overnight trips will be reviewed on a case by case basis. *Prior approval by campus principal is required.
*Our online protocols have been updated to reflect these changes.
I want to thank each of you for sharing your thoughts as we continue to work together through this pandemic. I know these changes will be celebratory for some and cause great concern for others. Please know that we will continue to monitor the data and make changes as necessary as well as create an environment where all students feel comfortable making whatever choice they feel is best in terms of their own health and safety.

This will allow you to fill out all of the required UIL forms for your daughter/son to participate in the 2021-2022 school year. These forms, along with your child's athletic physical information will be stored in our Rank One Sport+ Health online filing system. This will allow our coaches and athletic trainers to have quick access to any information we may need regarding your child. A printable version of these forms can also be found on the Gunter Athletics Webpage.

Please remember that all incoming 7th, 9th and 11th grade students are required to have a current physical form on file to participate in athletics. If your child does not have a current physical on file - they will need one before they can participate in athletics for the 2021-2022 school year. Physicals will be given on Wednesday, April 21st starting at 4:00 pm. (See schedule below). Students will need their physical form with the Medical History side filled out and signed by a parent or guardian.

GISD has purchased a blanket insurance policy for all athletes in grades 7-12 for the 2021-2022 school year. Dr. Siler presented the TAPR Report. While STAAR data was not available for 2020, Dr. Siler shared data on several other indicators showing tremendous performance at GHS:

- 5 Year Graduation Rate of $100 \%$
- $17 \%$ point increase in College \& Career Readiness (83.3\%)
- $8 \%$ point increase in students taking Dual Credit (50\% compared to state average of 23\%)
- $50 \%$ point increase in students completing an aligned sequence in Career Tech (82\%)
- $16 \%$ point increase in \# of students taking SAT / ACT (74\%)
- Average SAT score increased from 1090 to 1111 and ACT increased from 21.6 to 22.2
