

A reminder that our building opens at 7:10 every morning and our car line has no line between 7:10-7:30 each day. Beginning at 7:30 each day we have 9 staff members helping students open doors to help them in the building. Our first bell to dismiss students to class is at 7:40 with our tardy bell ringing at 7:45. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we continue to work through the challenges of a growing campus.




The 3rd graders wanted to show Perla, the GES custodian, some appreciation for all of her hard work. She keeps the school spotless!






