# Spotlight: GISD Police Department



## Background

- Associates of Applied Science in Criminal Justice from Grayson County College
- (1992) - Attended the Texoma Regional Police Academy
- (1992-1994) - Van Alstyne Police Department
- (1994) - Texas Highway Patrol Application / Attended the 7 month academy in Austin
- (1995 - 2012) - State Trooper assigned to Grayson County
- (2012) - Promoted to Corporal, transferred to McKinney
- (2016) - Promoted to Sergeant, assigned to Greenville
- Retired after 25 years in February 2020

We are excited to spotlight our new GISD Chief of Police this month, Shannon Thomas. We asked him why he wanted to come out of retirement to start our police department. Chief Thomas explained that there were two specific reasons that he was interested in this position. First, he loved being a positive role model and mentor for his son and the students in the Pottsboro area through coaching soccer, assisting in youth basketball and football, working as a parent booster with the FFA, and helping his son's boy scout troop. "Working with kids were very rewarding moments," said Chief Thomas. The second reason this job appealed to him was because of the 2018 tragic Sante Fe High School shooting. Governor Abbott asked the Texas Department of Public Safety to develop a program to assist rural school districts with a Troopers in School programs. Coach Thomas said, "I had been sent to four different active shooter programs and numerous emergency management programs during my time as a Corporal and Sergeant and was honored to be chosen as the pilot program Sergeant in Hunt County. He coordinated the pilot program with 12 troopers which helped several rural school districts increase their safety. By the time he retired, there were approximately 300 troopers around the State assigned to rural school districts, and the program is still in place.



**What kind of department do you hope to build here at this district?** "Protection of the students and staff is the number one priority of my position. Second is mentorship, and I hope to be invited to be involved in school committees regarding student activities and programs. I am setting the ground work for the future growth of the protection of Gunter ISD. As the growth from Collin County continues to move north, within the next decade Gunter will see a massive amount of growth. Outside of protection and mentorship, I would like the new Gunter ISD Police Department to be prepared in advance to handle the growth of the school district and the new challenges that will come with the growth."

**What have you loved about your new position?** "Being around the students and developing a professional mentorship with them has been what I have enjoyed the most. In just one month, students are already starting to communicate with me in the hallways and during games. Building trust with our students is a priority and being a part of the Gunter ISD family has been a fantastic transition from one form of law enforcement to a new type of law enforcement. I feel blessed that the Gunter ISD Administration chose me to start the new school police department and to represent Gunter ISD."

## Box Tops for Education App

**No more clipping!** Just download the Box Tops app, shop as you normally would, then simply scan your store receipts to find participating products. The app will automatically credit your school's Box Tops earnings online.

This is one way to help your school financially, and it doesn't cost you anything but a little tiny spec of time!

## FIFTEEN APPS

*parents should know about*

**MEETME**

MEETME is a dating social media app that allows users to connect with people based on geographic proximity. As the app's name suggests, users are encouraged to meet each other in person.

**GRINDR**

GRINDR is a dating app geared towards gay, bisexual and transgender people. The app gives users options to chat, share photos and meet up based on a smart phone's GPS location.

**SKOUT**

SKOUT is a location based dating app and website. While users under 17 years old are unable to share private photos, kids can easily create an account using a different age.

**WHATSAPP**

WHATSAPP is a popular messaging app that allows users to send texts, photos, voicemails, make calls and video chats world wide. WHATSAPP uses an internet connection on smart phones and computers.

**TIKTOK**

TIKTOK is a new mobile app popular with kids used for creating and sharing short videos. With very limited privacy controls, users are vulnerable to cyber bullying and explicit content.

**BADOO**

BADOO is a dating and social networking app where users can chat, share photos and videos and connect based on location. While the app is intended for adults only, teens are known to create profiles.

**BUMBLE**

BUMBLE is similar to the popular dating app "Tinder" however, it requires women to make the first contact. Kids have been known to use BUMBLE to create fake accounts and falsify their age.

**SNAPCHAT**

SNAPCHAT is one of the most popular apps in recent years. While the app promises users can take a photo/video and it will disappear, new features including "stories" allows users to view content for up to 24 hours. Snapchat also allows users to see your location.

**KIK**

KIK allows anyone to contact and direct message your child. Kids can bypass traditional text messaging features. KIK gives users unlimited access to anyone, anywhere, anytime.

**LIVE.ME**

LIVE.ME is a live-streaming video app that uses geolocation to share videos so users can find out a broadcaster's exact location. Users can earn "coins" as a way to "pay" minors for photos.

**HOLLA**

HOLLA is a self-proclaimed "addicting" video chat app that allows users to meet people all over the world in just seconds. Reviewers say they have been confronted with racial slurs, explicit content and more.

**WHISPER**

WHISPER is an anonymous social network that promotes sharing secrets with strangers. It also reveals a user's location so people can meet up.

**ASK.FM**

ASK.FM is known for cyber bullying. The app encourages users to allow anonymous people to ask them questions.

**CALCULATOR%**

CALCULATOR% is only one of SEVERAL secret apps used to hide photos, videos, files and browser history.

**HOT OR NOT**

HOT OR NOT encourages users to rate your profile, check out people in their area and chat with strangers. The goal of this app is to hook up.

## Forced Perspective

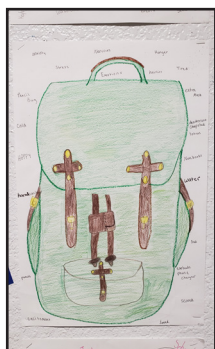

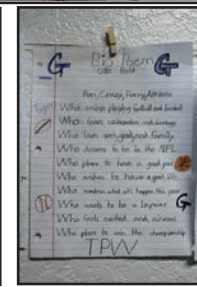
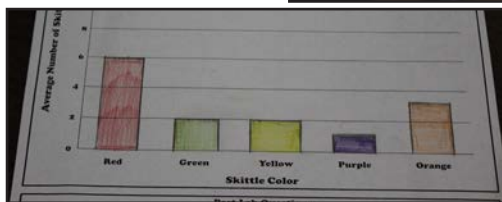
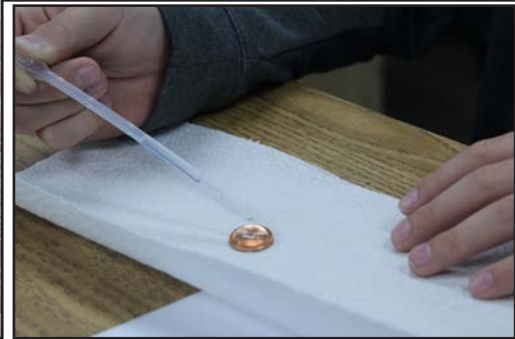


The students research in this classroom might just spark a career for somebody who will help build a more hurricane-proof building for those living on the coast in the future.

# 5th Grade Follies

The 5th grade students have been busy! In Mrs. Bon's science lab, the students have been working on learning the Scientific Method. They have completed two labs to practice going through the steps.

In the first lab, students had to guess how many drops of water a penny would hold, and in another lab, the students were guessing how many of a certain colored Skittles were in a snack size bag. In science, making a guess isn't just "guessing"... they were hypothesizing! After following all of the steps in each lab, the students now have a better understanding of the scientific method. By the way, did you know that a penny can hold close to 60 drops of water? The students teamed up to make sure the counting was correct, and the number of drops varied, but they were certainly higher than what they thought.

In Mrs. Freeny's math class the 5th grade students were snoozing, but not in the way you might think! They were sharpening their problem solving skills as they moved about outside on a "Snoozing Safari". The mission: Locate and solve challenging word problems about the sleep habits of unusual animals.

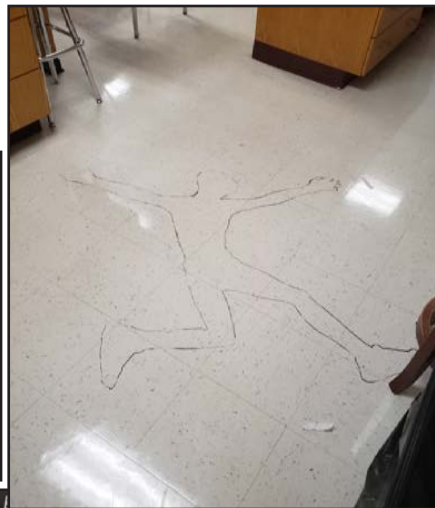

# Bowling Balls - Light as a Feather?

Students in Mrs. Wallis's physics class were determining the acceleration due to gravity on Earth by dropping objects and comparing the speed at which they dropped.

The objective of the lesson was to show that air resistance did indeed make objects drop at different rates. BUT... did you know that if you remove the air and drop two objects of ANY weight, they will drop at the exact same rate? Unfortunately, we can't remove the air in our classrooms, so the students watched this experiment unfold through a video created at NASA, and it is incredible! ## SOLVING THE MYSTERY!

Mrs. McDonald's science students had a small taste of what a forensic scientist might do when analyzing a crime scene. The students walked into an unfamiliar scene in their classroom... a crime scene! They were told they needed to solve the murder mystery using science.

In the lab they analyzed stomach contents from the victim to find biomolecules such as simple sugars, carbohydrates, fats, and proteins.

The test results were compared with other clues to figure out who committed the crime.

# National Merit Scholars

Reya Dawlah, Robert Rehmet, and Mary Smith were named to the list of 2021 National Merit Scholarship Program Commended Students.

The National Merit Scholarship Program recognized three seniors from Gunter High School for their exceptional academic promise demonstrated by their outstanding performance on the 2019 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®).

Approximately 34,000 Commended Students throughout the nation were recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2021 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students placed among the top 50,000 scorers out of the more than 1.5 million students who entered the 2021 competition.

"These students represent a valuable national resource; recognizing their accomplishments, as well as the key role their schools play in their academic development, is vital to the advancement of educational excellence in our nation. 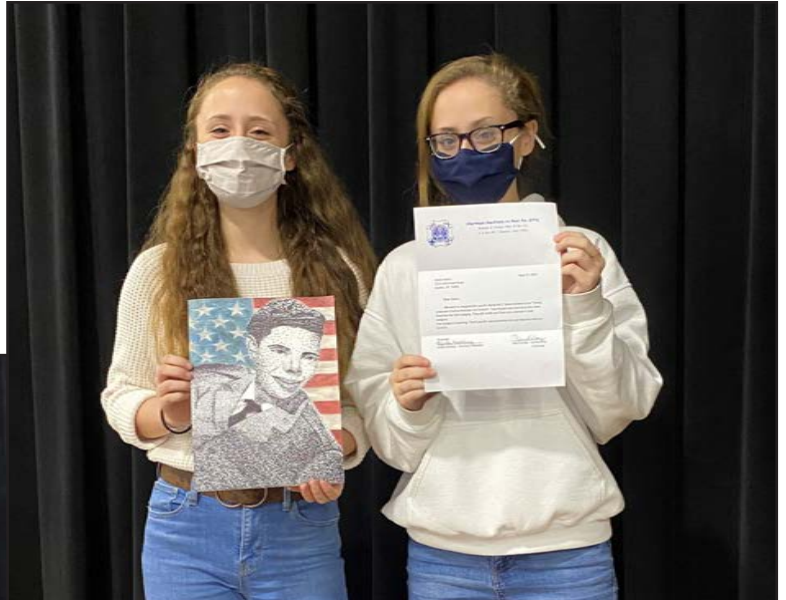
