



Due to widespread flu and illness, Gunter ISD chose to close the doors on Thursday, January 18th and reopened them on Wednesday, January 24th. We had 253 students absent which is 27% of our district. Out of 194 absences at GES and GMS, 141 were either confirmed flu or flu-like symptoms including a fever or confirmed strep. With that data, Dr. Siler decided it was best to close the doors and disinfect our campuses.

During the closing, all GISD facilities were deep cleaned to prevent further spread of illness. GISD contracted GermBlast, a professional company to sanitize and disinfect all buildings and buses along with deep cleaning by our full-time custodial staff. No Lego, math manipulative, potato head piece or building block went untouched!

As this flu season continues to be one of the most serious in nearly a decade, the steps that Gunter

ISD chose to take were shared all over the country. Good Morning America did a live broadcast from one of our elementary classrooms, Dr. Siler was interviewed by ABC World News and also was seen live on CNN's Headline News!












# Life Lessons

### Gunter goes to STATE again! All-State Choir and Band

Over 70,000 students initially enter the All-State competitive process, and only 1,780 students are selected to perform in 15 All-State ensembles (bands, orchestras, and choirs), and Gunter will send 2 students!

All-State performances will be held as part of the annual TMEA Clinic/Convention, Feb. 14–17 where over 29,000 people from Texas and around the world will attend over 280 workshops, 100 performances, and visit over 1,300 exhibit booths at this nation's largest music educators convention.

High school students selected to perform in the All-State concerts have competed through auditions to qualify at the state level. All-State is the highest honor a Texas music student can receive. This competitive process begins throughout the state in auditions hosted by 33 TMEA Regions. Individual musicians perform selected music for a panel of judges who rank each instrument or voice part. From this ranking, a select group of musicians advances from their Region to compete against musicians from other areas in eight TMEA Area competitions. The highest-ranking musicians judged at the TMEA Area competitions qualify to perform in a TMEA All-State music group. Only the top 2.5% of musicians who initially audition become All-State musicians.

### KARA CURTIS - ALL STATE CHOIR

Kara Curtis, a member of the Gunter High School/Chamber Choir will perform with the Texas All-State Small School Choir. Kara is a student of Barbara Hanning and sings at school under the direction of Elizabeth Kulbeth who is a member of the Texas Music Educators Association. This is Kara's first time to perform as a member of a TMEA All-State organization. Kara is the daughter of Bill and Nicole Curtis.



### BRIAN AVENDANO - ALL STATE BAND

Brian Avendano a member of the Gunter High School Band will perform with the Association of Small School Bands All-State Band. Brian is a student of Chad Smith and plays clarinet at school under the direction of Thomas Bremer who is a member of the Texas Music Educators Association. 


# **Isolating Fungus!**

# Making an IMPACT

I needed to discuss scheduling options with a tenth grader while at the same time garner a little financial advice from his father. A text. A response. A follow-up. Once the information came through that Dad was off shore attending a leadership conference, I apologized for interrupting business and inquired how I could get a hold of Ryan. "Well, actually he is here with me," Dad responded.

Lynn Reed made a decision ten years ago to take it to the next level. He sought out the best in the mortgage lending business and began making contacts and rubbing shoulders to glean insight on how to improve as a business leader and capitalize on a hot market. The answer was simple: customer service. Lynn also saw opportunity to grow as a husband, father, and community servant within the same process. A young set of eyes was watching Dad. "Ryan expressed an interest in growing as a student leader so I thought 'come hear' from some of the best leaders in business and hang out with Dad."

Two years later the senior is spending his final months as a high school student looking to make one final impact.


"As a student leader, I have seen many opportunities to enhance my leadership skills," Ryan explains. "One of these ways was by participating in multiple organizations."

Gunter High School prides itself in promoting the whole student experience. The majority of students are multi-activity and crossover into all facets of academic, athletic, fine art, and service programs. The Gunter-"way" is to "make a way" for a student that is willing to grind to do it all in their very short four years. All that is required by the student is to put in the work. Ryan Reed played multiple sports as a freshman but soon realized there was a better path to building his portfolio for the next level and growing as a young adult. Ryan is a member of the faculty appointed Student Council Advisory Team, founder and leader of the campus Interact club, and catalyst in the popular Ambush Student Section.

Ryan's goals are simple. "My long term goal is to succeed in all aspects in my life," he states. "I want to

make a good living for myself and my family, but more importantly I desire to be a person that makes an impact on the citizens of my town and my community as well."

Ryan sought out new mathematics teacher Dean Johnson as a



potential faculty liaison for the Interact Club. "Ryan has great initiative and vision for helping the school and community," says Mr. Johnson. "He values community service and helps lead younger students in that same direction."


Ryan identifies his participation in the Rotary Youth Leadership Academy as a point in time when his vision for the future began to take shape. Junior students apply for a scholarship each spring that enables them to represent their high school in a week of leadership training sponsored by a local chapter of Rotary International. A committee interviews perspective students and selects one male and female student to spend a week at RYLA camp. This camp is the crème of the crop of Texas High School Seniors. The experience pushes students physically, emotionally, and mentally to dig deep into who they are and how they can enhance their gifts for the purpose of servant leadership. The camp leadership is all former RYLA camp participants. No student that attends returns the same.

"I up'd my game after attending RYLA," Ryan proclaims. "It gave me confidence to lead in my own community. That confidence was missing."

Ryan adds that he "learned to use positive reinforcement to lead, getting others involved, and leading from behind when I need to."

Upon returning from RYLA, Ryan dove head first into his opportunities in Student Council. "STUCO is very important to me because it teaches responsibility and how to manage opportunities," Ryan says. "We have

been involved in numerous activities, and it has been nice to learn from others and how to assemble opportunities."

Students that participate in RYLA speak to their local Rotary chapter upon their return in a way to say thank you for sponsoring their opportunity. This event led to a chance meeting with a "Rotarian" that targeted Ryan as a student that could benefit from Interact. "I wanted to start the Interact club so I could help make an impact on my school and community. After doing the clothes drive, I saw the community come together for a greater cause and it was a really special moment for me."

People that have worked with Ryan are not surprised by his growth. "Ryan is a born leader," asserts Gunter High School AP teacher Jill Dodd. "He always has a smile on his face, and students and teachers alike, seem to gravitate toward his sunny personality. People enjoy following someone like Ryan."


Away from school, the fun-loving Ryan likes to work out and play video games. He loves the weight room and works hard to stay in shape. Multiple knee injuries in a span of two years cut short opportunities outside of cross-country for action on the field or court. Still the competitor, Ryan declares, "I am always down to play some NBA 2K and will take on anyone willing to step up." Ryan's short-term goals are to focus on making all A's his senior year in an effort to "finish strong." He also is committed to attending weekly Wednesday night youth group and applying for every scholarship possible.

Ryan credits his father and stepmother LeeAnn along with his older brother and two younger sisters for being the type of family that supports one another in every venture. However, the most influential person in is life is his mother Amy Bready. "She has loved me and supported me since day one and I will always be grateful for everything she sacrificed to take care of me."

Twelve hours removed from the State Final at AT&T Stadium Ryan, pulls his SUV up to the Gunter High School front doors. His grandfather Ralph Reed follows behind in his pickup with trailer in tow. A blustery north wind accompanied by sleet pelt the windows of the now desolate school officially shut down for winter break. Ryan has one more obligation to fulfill just three days before Christmas. Boxes upon boxes and garbage sacks of donated clothing stored in a semi-used classroom must be loaded up, resorted, and delivered to a shelter in Sherman. One by one Ryan, his grandfather, and the author of this story drag the articles now ripping through bags out to the cold in an attempt to pile them into every nook and cranny afforded them. Ryan's smile never fades despite the mountains of work ahead of him this cold December day. "If I can just get this to our garage I can re-sort it and load it back up," he processes his game plan out-loud. The project was a school-wide effort but on this day, Ryan bears sole responsibility in seeing it to completion.

After the last item is squeezed into the passenger side of Ryan's vehicle and the door slams shut, he shakes a hand and with a smile says "Merry Christmas...see you in a couple weeks." Ryan's focus is on people he does not know and will probably never meet. An opportunity for impact is there for the taking. He is going to make the most of it.

And for that reason Ryan Reed is our first Tiger Times Student of the Month for the 2018 calendar year.
