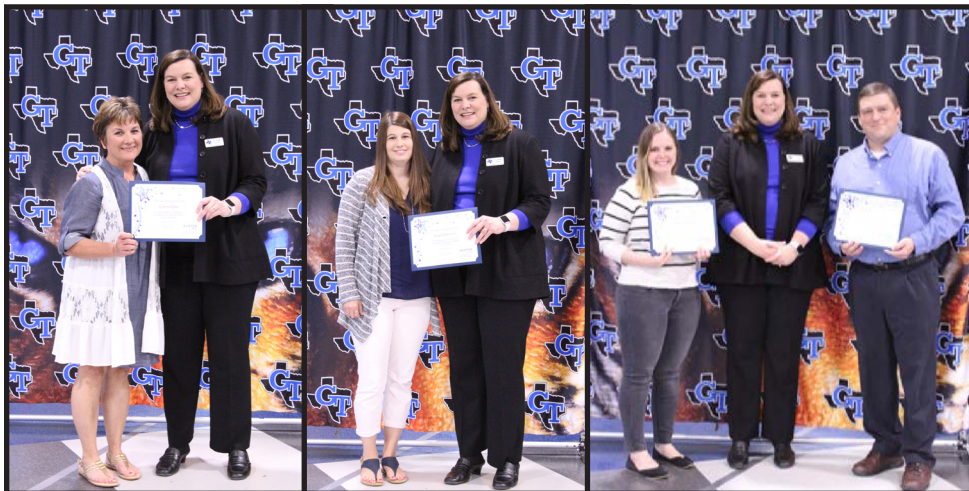

SAFETY FIRST!

A HUGE thanks to everyone who came out to last month's Community Forum on School Safety & Security. We were overwhelmed by how many joined the conversation to be part of the solution to make our schools and students as safe as possible! A big thanks to the Gunter Police Department who partnered with us to host this event.

The event started with Dr. Siler sharing some of the safety improvements from the last 6 years:

- Secure Vestibules with Electronic Access
- Video Surveillance: Added cameras to all campuses
- Bus Security: Security Cameras & Radios
- Visitor Management System: Raptor System
- Classroom Communication System: Phones in all classrooms
- Safety & Security Audits: Audit of entire district completed in 2017
- Student / Staff Training & Drills: Fire, Evacuation, Lockdown, etc.



She then shared data from the Staff & Community Surveys highlighting some of the most significant areas of concern for the district and had table conversations on options to address each of these issues:

- Travel between campuses & facilities (we have 500+ students that travel between the MS & HS, athletic facilities, ag barn up to 8 times a day)
- Issues with doors; kids opening doors for people; propping doors open
- Glass vestibules are not bulletproof
- Training of staff & students
- Outdoor recess (GES + 5th Gr) / lunch activities (GMS)
- Lack of IDs for students & staff
- Issues with Raptor System
- Vestibule at GMS leads directly into campus

Dr. Siler then shifted the conversation to social & emotional health, focusing on how we identify students in need and how we support them. She shared a video from the Sandy Hook Foundation on gun violence warning signs that fostered rich conversation. That link is posted at the link listed below.



One of the highlight's of the night was hearing from our own expert panel: Chief Shawn Johnson and Sergeant Danny Jones from Gunter PD; Gunter residents Gary McHone (retired Prosper Assistant Chief of Police) and Darin Smith (Allen Police Department); Grayson County Sheriff Captain Harvey Smitherman and Texas Ranger Brad Oliver. Each shared suggestions, training ideas and how they're working together to keep us safe at school.

From structural upgrades to social & emotional health to solutions moving forward, it was an informative and impactful night. All of the presentation materials have been shared on our website - or the direct link here: <https://tinyurl.com/gidsafetyforum>

The thing about student safety is that the work is never done. There is no box to check to say “we’ve achieved safety.” Instead, it is an everyday effort of “how do we make our kids safer today than they were yesterday?” In other words, the work was ongoing before this event and has continued ever since. Each of the table discussion facilitators took copious notes which the leadership team compiled and drafted the working plan below of “next steps” to take to continue our efforts to make Gunter ISD the safest place for kids to be!

Nothing fishy going on in this room... well, maybe!

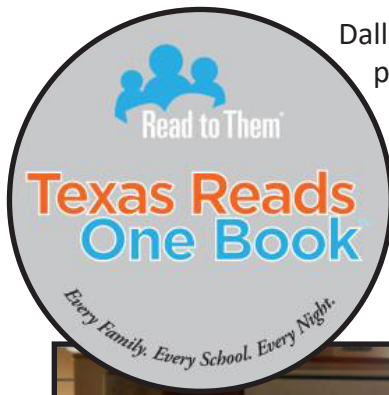

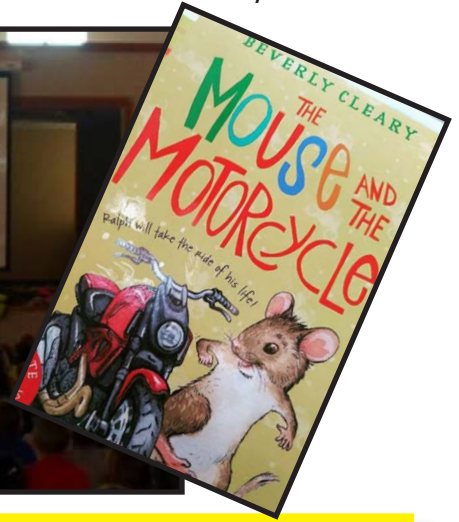
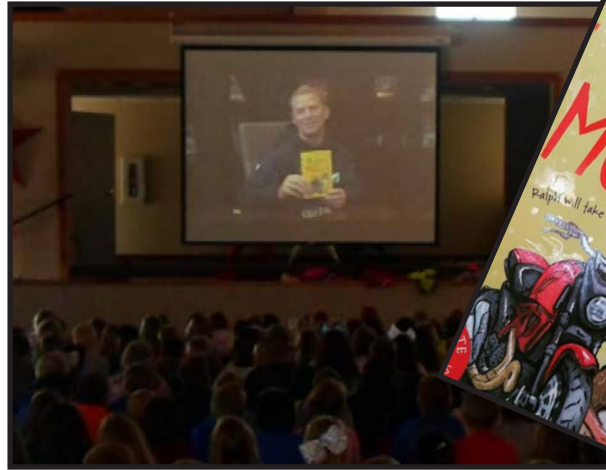
IT'S A ZOO IN HERE!

Running into the Future

A drive up Kerfoot Road reveals that the “new” stadium turf has arrived. A long overdue resurfacing of the oval surrounding the playing surface will be in place by the time this story goes to print. By the last day of school, lanes, exchange zones, runways, pads, and sandpits will be completed. Gone is a facility thirty years old and in desperate need of modernization. A new era in Gunter High School athletics will begin.



A quick glance in the trophy case greeting visitors to the Event Center points to a strong tradition in track and field. Individuals and relay teams routinely make annual trips to Mike Myers Stadium in Austin each May. Twelve students made a run at Austin this spring and advanced to the Regional Championships in Whitehouse. All but one returns next fall. Chances are they will begin putting work in and enjoying their

new “duds” the minute the facility is cleared for use.

Coaches and athletes used their creative side all winter and spring to find a flat patch or area suitable for work. Van Alstyne and Celina graciously opened their tracks for our students to work after hours and on their own. Meets became extended practices. Each week the performances improved. More importantly, our students became hungry, realizing that with time and resources, the opportunity for success is there for the taking.

A foursome of young ladies made particular use of the opportunity before them and boasted the number two time going into the regional meet in the crown jewel of high school track meets, the 4x400 or “mile” relay. Their time of 4:09, a significant improvement from times posted only weeks prior, was bested by defending state champion Leonard, who enjoys the labor of two young ladies heading to Duke University on track scholarships. Regional meets have a way of separating those ready and those still a year away, and the Lady Tigers will not be represented in Austin this May. However, the future looks bright for the GHS girl’s athletic program. Each sport is well stocked

with youth, and participation is high all the way down into the elementary grades. Citizens can rest assured that the new facilities, including a new strength and conditioning center to open this Summer, and a complete renovation of the “old gym”, will be put to good use the next decade.

Sarah Franze is this year’s Valedictorian and she leaves quite a mark on our high school campus. Her exploits in the classroom and on fields of play are stellar, but she will be remembered more for the way she leads. Sarah is the lone Senior in the group of athletes that traveled to Regionals this year. Next month’s Tiger Times will feature her and Salutatorian Camryn McDonald. Sarah took the time this month to interview her 4x4 relay teammates: Sophomore Brianna Carr, Sophomore Nancy Castorena, and Freshman Jacee Childers.

Jacee Childers is a big part of the future. She is talented. More appropriately - she is fast!

“I run track not because I think the running itself is fun, but because the feeling you get when you see your hard work payoff is awesome,” the freshman admits. “To me wearing the blue and black means having pride in my school and working

hard to represent it well.” Jacee also plays volleyball in addition to being exceptional in the classroom. She earned honors for her play on the court, as well as being named academic all-district. “I think people can expect the girls athletic program to continue to excel and improve each year. I think the leadership and work ethic our program has will lead us to championships..”

Brianna Carr is no longer “Trey Carr’s sister”. The fiery competitor is making a name for herself with the grit she routinely displays. “I run for the competition and for my teammates. By running track it doesn’t just benefit for that specific sport but for all of the other sports you play and the entire girls athletics program as well.” Bri backs up her claims by running cross country, playing basketball, and softball, in addition to track. She is also a solid

student. Bri loves being a Gunter Tiger. “To be able to wear the blue and black and have Gunter across my chest is something I look forward to every week. I love competing and getting to represent my school while doing so.” Bri agrees with Jacee that a new era in Gunter athletics is set to begin. “People can expect a big turn in the girls athletic program, in a good way. I believe that these next few years we will have girls and coaches who are all trying to achieve the same goals and push each other past their limits, which will allow for us to be successful in all aspects.”

Being pushed to the limits is nothing new for Nancy Castorena. She is the younger sister of Rod, Daniel, and Leo, who not only achieved greatness as Tiger athletes, but also as students and faculty members. Her sister Rosie is getting set to begin her career in education and she was

a standout student as well. “It is truly special to represent a community like Gunter,” Nancy says. “It’s home, this community is full of successful people and it has meant much to my family.” Nancy, like her teammates, is tough. Coach Jake Parker knows that he can count on Nancy to give every single fiber of herself when the baton is in her hand. “Nancy is a fighter,” Jake Parker declares. “She will run through a wall for you and will run someone over if she has to,” Coach Parker laughs.

“I run because I love the feeling I receive when I have overcome obstacles and do things that I never imagined I could. Most importantly, I run for my teammates, track has created a bond that will never be broken. The feeling I receive when I see us succeed is a feeling that nothing can compare to,” Nancy adds. “People should expect from the girls program that we’re here to compete and work hard. Coach Daniel Castorena has always said that there is no secret pill, there is no magic that anybody could take that could make you successful. The only thing that makes you successful is hard work.”

If you see some young ladies making laps around the track this summer, or working build-ups on the new turf, chances are it’s Bri, Nancy, or Jacee. Expect someone to take Sarah’s spot on the 4x4 and a Lady Tiger relay to make a trip to Austin next May. And for that reason we salute the Lady Tiger 4x400 relay team and all of our Gunter High School Lady Tigers for their efforts this year. They are the Tiger Times Students of the Month for May.

Reaching for the STARS
