2017-18 will be a year to remember!

GROWTH...

What an AMAZING first two weeks of school! We hope you enjoyed the Back to School pics – there was so much excitement in our hallways at all of our campuses! There were also a LOT more KIDS!!! We are currently at 924 students districtwide with several more headed our way next month! That is an increase of 114 students from last fall, or 14% districtwide! Even more surprising, 89 students of the 114 are new residents in Gunter (not transfer students). Given that significant increase, I wanted to share with you some of the things we are doing proactively to prepare for growth:



Dr. Jill Siler Inter ISD Superintenden:

- 1. **Strategic Planning:** Within our Strategic Planning process, growth is one of the Gunter ISD Superintendent five main areas. We have a broad-based group of school and community members focused on sustainable growth with an emphasis on preparation and a major focus on maintaining our culture while we grow.
- 2. **Demographic Study:** Gunter ISD has contracted with a demographer who will begin the process of talking with future developers, existing MUDs, city leadership and other entities to give us our first look at what a future build-out could look like including 5 and 10 year projections.
- 3. Facility Analysis: Our board will engage in a deep study of our facilities, focusing on capacities at each campus; start the discussion process for preferred school sizes; and long-term building plan for facilities. We will also be looking at when future bond funds might be available and what we may need to do in the gap between when a building might be needed vs. when a building could actually be built (for example, if we feel we need a new campus in 5 years but our property values won't be high enough to call for a bond election for 7 years, what will we do in the meantime?).
- 4. **Deepening Relationships with the City:** The Board had its first Joint Meeting with the Gunter city leadership last month to open lines of communication about what each entity is seeing in terms of future growth and development along with discussions of areas for future partnerships.
- 5. Looking for Land: The GOOD news is that there are several elementary and middle school sites that have been dedicated to GISD in MUD agreements. The BAD news is that many of these agreements are old and as new developers come into play, we're not 100% sure they are all locked in. Another challenge is that we may need land before one of these MUDs come online. Finally, these dedicated sites are only 12-15 acres and a fully built out high school campus requires between 60-80 acres. Our current combined MS/HS site is 33. We will continue to look for land for a future high school site as land prices will continue to rise. Having said that, a future high school will most likely not be the next campus built. Our most pressing need is for space at the younger grades, given that GES has our largest population at 370 students and that campus is built on 3.99 acres (i.e., little room for expansion).
- 6. **Transfer Policies:** As I've shared in the past, nearly 20% of our total enrollment includes transfer students from 17 different surrounding communities. These students bring in well over \$1 million every year! This year our transfer process was extremely competitive and less than 50% of all applications were accepted. Later this fall we will be considering whether to close any grade levels or campuses to transfers for 2018-19 to ensure there is room for future growth. These decisions will only impact future transfer students (not current transfer students or siblings of current transfer students).

ALL this to say... we're ON it! While we may not know what our future will bring, we can be aggressive in our planning, conservative in our financial decisions and proactive in preparing every aspect of our organization for what lies ahead. We have the best Board of Trustees and Leadership Team in the state and I'm so thankful to be a part of the incredible future of Gunter ISD!



The District wide theme for 2017-18 is Growing Champions. Everyone knows we like to enhance the Ambush (Tiger Family) at Gunter High School, and a theme centered on growth is very appropriate.

Sixty-two Seniors crossed the graduation threshold in 2017. We planned to welcome the same number back to campus in August in the form of the Class of 2021. That would keep our enrollment around 260 students, with a few expected new residents and a handful of transfers.

At the time of writing, our student body has GROWN to 295 students. The unexpected surge is being felt district wide as over 100 new students have joined the Ambush. In true Texan and Gunter fashion, we would like to welcome and introduce our new students to you:

The mega high schools in Collin County may offer an expanded course catalog, but student access to faculty assistance and being encouraged to participate in multiple programs is difficult, if not unrealistic. Jailyn is already suiting up for the Lady Tiger JV Volleyball team.

Hannah has already joined the Tiger Band and Choir programs and will participate in a bevy of UIL academic events. Her sister, Rachel Watson, graduated in 2014 from Gunter. Sara Sepeda left Gunter to attend Sherman High School the past three years, but now a Senior, felt it was time to come back "home." We are glad she did! The same can be said for Mya St. Clair, except she really had the longest road back. Mya, and her family made a job move back to Oregon. Upon checking out last year we joked with Mya, "you will be back!" And she is, and we are glad!

Everyone knows Stephenie Pelley who took a twoyear sabbatical to Tioga. Now a Freshman, she is back where she belongs in the land of blue and white, and she picked up right where she left off. It's like she never left. Stephenie does it all, including: cross country, basketball, and track.

She feels the move to Gunter gives her a better chance at making the grades she needs to pursue the career of choice. Summer took a couple years off from music but jumped at the chance to join our Tiger Band.

Garrett Vogel heard great things about the academics and program in Gunter, so he made the switch from being a Sherman Bearcat to earning Tiger stripes. His goals are to make all A's and maybe win a "championship" during his time here. Garrett plans on running Cross Country, in addition to playing Basketball and Baseball.

Landry Laird felt like a small fish in a big green ocean and desired to jump into something more like a pond. Landry's parents moved into Gunter from Prosper, and this Freshman feels it gives him a better chance to pursue his dream of getting into the Naval Academy. Speaking of ponds – Landry loves to fish. He also loves when they are frozen over! Landry is a on an elite level hockey team and travels the Southwest competing.

Kaylee Pruiett desires a "new start". She also felt the crunch of an ever expanding Prosper school system. Kaylee says she wants a better opportunity to learn in a smaller classroom setting. She plans on playing basketball, softball, and joining HOSA. Kaylee's freshman brother, Beau, is joining her in Gunter and is already involved in football.

Hannah Abee's parents, like many coming in to the

region, made a job move from Austin. Hannah is dedicated in her studies and the honor student also brings extracurricular experience to Gunter that is greatly needed. Hannah was a standout student athletic trainer at her former high school. She will be joining our Tiger Football sideline team.

Junior Micaela Shanks is also enjoying a vastly different setting than she lived as a Wylie HS Pirate (6A). Micaela is already plugged in to our Tiger Band program. Freshman Akasha Hill was in a vastly different setting in small town Nocona, Texas. But like Micaela she quickly found a home in the Tiger Band.

Teige Harris' mother Tory made the four hour haul from West Texas weekly as a trauma nurse in Plano. Teige's father specializes in supplying an industry most common on the Caprock/South Plains region – water wheels – the big kind! The Harris's finally decided a move to the Metroplex was possible to eliminate the countless tires, oil changes, and gallons of fuel on mama's SUV. "Gunter is not much different than what I'm used to in Frenship," Teige says. "It is a very similar way of life." Teige has found a home on the Tiger Football team.

- Dr. Siler & Board recognized TMEA Honor Band Members & Director
- Dr. Siler & Board recognized 2017 Media Honor Roll Recipients from Herald Democrat. Gunter ISD nominated Jonathan Cannon and Drew Smith from the Herald Democrat along with Brittany Harlow from KXII for her work in providing fair and excellent coverage of GISD news and students.
- A full Financial Report was given
- Communications
 - O Back to School Update. Dr. Siler shared that GISD welcomed 924 students back to school. That 924 is an increase of 114 students from last fall which is a 14% increase. 90 of the 114 students were residents and 24 were transfer students. Dr. Siler shared class size averages at all campuses (Elem 16.7 to 18.0 in a class; MS 13.8 to 23.0 in a class; and HS 15.8-18.1). She also shared a basic look at a 5 year projection based on this year's enrollment growth (with and without new transfers) and mentioned that later this fall the board would have conversations about whether to close specific grade levels and campuses to new transfers for next year. At this time, our Elementary campus is the largest in population (370) and the smallest in land size (3.99 acres) whereas MS and HS have a little more space at 263 students and 295 students respectively. *See attached update on Growth for steps GISD is taking to prepare for increased enrollment.
 - o Strategic Planning Update. Action Teams will kick off this month and the board anticipates approving the plan in its entirety on November 16th.
