Gunter ISD Foundation Trust Awards \$10,000 in Campus Grants



(Gunter, Texas – November 8, 2015) Gunter ISD Foundation Trust (GIFT) awarded nearly \$10,000 in Campus Grants to support innovative teaching practices across Gunter ISD. GIFT is a public non-profit volunteer organization whose funds are directed toward educational programs. Funding priorities include both need and meritbased scholarships, innovative campus teaching grants and a permanent endowment fund.

Teachers across the district were surprised as the GIFT Board of Directors, campus and district leaders and members from the GHS Marching Band came to their classrooms to make the special presentation of grant funds.

The 2015 Campus Grants that were awarded include technology initiatives such as Kindle Fires for a small-group reading classroom, iPads and an Apple TV for the science classroom; science

equipment including an electrical circuit kit, light optic kit and additional lab equipment; an additional welder for the Ag program and funds for our ESL students to see the Dallas Symphony's performance highlighting Latino composers. In toll, 6 campus grants were awarded totaling \$9,573. In order to retain as much funds as possible for student scholarship this spring, Gunter ISD matched the grant dollars for these projects to fund the nearly \$10,000 in innovative grants.



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Pawsitively -- A Heart of Gold



There was quite a buzz on campus Friday centered on "Buddy". Many in town have gotten to know Buddy and it is safe to assume he gained that name by his friendliness and frequent visits to a number of residences, businesses, and campuses. Buddy was specifically interested in attending Gunter High or Middle School – he didn't show a preference. Inquiries on Social Media for finding Buddy a permanent home were promising but left unfulfilled. Thankfully we have a student that was perfect for the job of providing direction for Buddy.

Karissa Pelfrey is a ninth grader at Gunter High School. She was recently nominated and awarded volunteer of the year by the Sherman Animal Shelter where Grayson County houses abandoned, neglected, or homeless animals. Karissa's interest in dogs began in elementary school when she and her mother were searching for a hobby. She started as a volunteer helping walk dogs at an off site adoption event in the fall of 2012 and guickly become a regular at the shelter and other local events handling dogs and educating adopters about spaying, neutering, and shelter policies. For her last few birthdays she has requested people sponsor adoptions rather than buying anything for her. "Dogs are little weird," she admits. "When you meet a dog they can be excited to meet you until the cage door is open and then they will run and hide. It is amazing how cruel and neglectful some people are with animals."

Last year Karissa became the main photographer for the volunteer's Facebook page after attending training sessions with the Dallas Animal Shelter. Social Media has become the most effective means

of Animal Advocacy. Karissa now spends her weekends taking pictures of the dogs while learning their personalities. She monitors the page and responds to questions about the animals and shelter policies. Karissa also frequents the local lost & found Facebook sites and helps reunite animals with their owners.

Karissa's volunteer efforts extend in to her own home. Her family has taken in four dogs and also serves as a frequent halfway house until dogs can be transported or adopted. Riley and Rocket, sister and brother Heeler mixes, were adopted from the Sherman Shelter. Stitch is a rescued Boston terrier. Emmitt is a stray Pit mix that a neighbor wanted to shoot. Karissa spoke of each of these dogs as part of the family. "This all started as a hobby," she admits. "But now it is just who we are."

The Texas Animal Control received a nomination for Karissa from the Sherman branch and invited the family for "training" in Abilene last month. Come to find out they wanted to award Karissa for her efforts as the 2015 State Volunteer of the Year. Not bad for a student that can't even drive. "Everyone should volunteer at something," she explains. "You give of yourself but always get back way more than you received."

If you haven't seen Buddy in a while that is because he is staying with Butch and Amanda Godwin. Their boys fell in love with the

dog and vice versa. Now he has a "home." Thank goodness Buddy crossed paths with Karissa Pelfrey. For her outstanding service she is my December (how fitting – a month of giving) Tiger Times Student of the Month.










Gunter graduate returns to campus with an important message


