

- Students should wear shoes appropriate for PE and recess. Flip-flops, backless sandals, wedges, and heels are not conducive to physical education and outdoor activities. Tennis shoes are preferred. Shoes with cleats or wheels are not allowed at school.
- Students may wear shorts/skirts/skorts. The minimum length for these garments is at the middle finger tip when arms are at the side.
- Pants, jeans, shorts, skirts, skorts, and leggings must fit at the waist and cover undergarments.
- Leggings, tight-fitting knit pants, may only be worn with a shirt/top that completely covers the bottom in a normal standing position. Shirts may not be tucked in the front.
- Jeans designed with holes may be worn as long as no skin is showing above fingertips when arms are at the side.
- Shirts/Tops with holes that expose skin are not allowed at school. Shirts/Tops must reach below the waistline and cover undergarments. Spaghetti strapped shirts, racer back shirts, halter tops, and muscle type shirts may only be worn under or over another shirt. Crop tops, see through shirts, and tops that fit off the shoulder are not allowed at school. The midriff must be covered at all times.
- Any apparel that is low cut in the front and/or back is not allowed at school.
- Clothing with pictures, emblems, or writings that are lewd, offensive, vulgar, obscene, advertise or depict tobacco, alcohol, or drug products are not allowed at school. This applies to body art as well.
- Appropriate undergarments are to be worn at all times and not visible.
- Pajamas, sleepwear, and house slippers are not allowed at school, unless on a designated day determined by the principal. Parents/guardians will be notified of such days.
- Caps, hats, and sunglasses are not to be worn inside the school building, unless on a designated day determined by the principal. Parents/guardians will be notified of such days.
- Earrings may be worn only by girls and only on the ear. Spacers in ears are not permitted by girls or boys.

If the principal determines that a student's clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given the opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary actions in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.
