What is One Rocket Nation?

Staff members collaborate to identify foundational values in precursor to upcoming strategic planning



Staff members collaborated in groups this year to start identifying important foundational values, and the words that represent them, for our district. They also brainstormed about future skills students will need, using as a touchstone the year our kindergartners graduate -- 2030.

Words are powerful. They represent ideas, emotions and knowledge. They represent values. In a fast-changing society that presents new challenges continuously, words can remind us of our priorities and the foundational values that ground us.

How we make our values our priorities

When we can agree on those values, we can effectively uphold them. The Bay Village City School District staff, for the past school year, has been meeting in groups to discuss and identify the words that represent our values. Who are we? Which values represent us? What is "One Rocket Nation?"

Teachers, aides, bus drivers, custodians, administrators, secretaries and board members, as well as PTA leaders and some students, have participated in group exercises that identify and rank our most important values. Rich conversations have

taken place, with everyone's voice included and given equal weight. The results will inform an upcoming strategic planning process that will involve community members as well as school staff and parents.

Values identified as central to who we are will help set priorities and plans moving forward. Top-ranked values of staff members were: **Respect, Community, High Expectations, Safety, Kindness, Family, Inclusivity, Serving and Empowerment.**

2030 Skills

In addition to foundational values, staff members researched and brainstormed the Power Competencies that students would need to have in an uncertain future. Rather than focus on specific skills, like coding or writing, lists of broad attributes were developed. **Perseverance**, for example, was a top-named competency. **Problem-solving, Communication, Creativity, Empathy, Adaptability and Self-Reliance** were more.

These attributes are considered skills, rather than character traits, because they can be learned and practiced. We consider them key to the success of our students, even for kindergartners who won't graduate until 2030.

What's Next?

One district goal is to include community members in a similar type of engagement to help guide the future direction of our schools. While state standards and testing continue to steer academic requirements for our students, we know that there is so much more needed by children. Recognizing and planning to meet the social, emotional, physical and mental health needs of students may go beyond academic requirements, but it is critical to learning and student success. The wisdom and resources of community members will be tapped through focus groups, surveys and other methods to be as representative of community members as possible. The Bay Village City School District seeks to identify, locate and evaluate all children from birth to age 21 who may have a disability.

A "child with disability" in Ohio means a child under age twenty-two who has an intellectual disability, a hearing impairment (including deafness), a speech or language impairment, a visual impairment (including blindness), a serious emotional disturbance, an orthopedic impairment, autism, traumatic brain injury, any other health impairment, a specific learning disability (including dyslexia), deaf-blindness, a developmental delay (for a child between the ages of three and five), or multiple disabilities; and who, by reason thereof, needs special education and related services. Parents may not be aware that their child has a disability or that there are programs and services available. Parents, relatives, public and private agency employees, and concerned citizens, are asked to help find any child who may have a disability and need special education and related services. Notify the Bay Village City School District Department of Student Services at 440-617-7300. District officials will talk with the parents to determine if an evaluation is necessary.

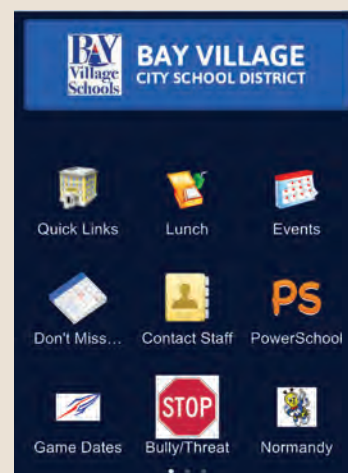
