Improvement Plan Focus Area: Implement a tiered literacy curriculum (Wit & Wisdom) that follows the Science of Reading.

Priority Area: Based on the identified focus area, what issue needs to be addressed to achieve the goal? K-6 Classroom, SPED, and reading teachers will be trained in Wit and Wisdom and begin implementation in their classroom.

Desired Outcome: When fully implemented, what will be different as a result of addressing this priority?

Students will understand the importance of reading for life. They will be given opportunities to deepen their understanding in multiple content areas. Vocabulary and writing skills will be implemented alongside the Wit and Wisdom curriculum to deepen comprehension.

Root Cause(s): What is the heart of the issue? What evidence supports this conclusion? Student test scores show a higher than normal percentage of students that are reading below grade level. The district did not have an overall K-6 literacy curriculum in place. NWEA, Moby Max, and state testing results support this conclusion.

Alignment to District Goal: Through the implementation of the Wit and Wisdom reading curriculum, classrooms will be given materials and tools to enhance literacy development. The tiered use of this curriculum school wide will increase the academic scores and success for every student.
