

## ~ Suggestions for mascot released and voting begins ~

NEARLY 450 mascot suggestions were received, garnering over 190 unique ideas. The mascot committee members narrowed the list down to six choices, keeping in mind the characteristics of the mascot and features of our school. The six were presented to the Estelline Board of Education at their April 9th meeting. With the board's approval of the final list of names, open voting to community, alumni, students, and staff begins immediately.

#### **IMPORTANT POINTS:**

- ~ The school colors will <u>REMAIN THE SAME</u>, regardless of what new mascot is chosen.
- ~ The change will be at little or no cost to the school district. Almost all imagery has previously been removed and uniforms, school attire, flooring, letterhead, etc. already only bear the name "Estelline" or "E."
- ~ Effective Fall 2018, Estelline will begin an all-sport cooperative with the Hendricks, MN School District. Our teams will be announced as "Estelline-Hendricks." Hendricks is agreeable to the new mascot we chose. Although a long-term agreement is planned, should the cooperative ever dissolve, we will not be changing the mascot again.

#### **TIMELINE AND VOTING:**

- ~ Only ONE vote per individual will be counted.
- ~ The individual's name *must* be included and *must* be legible for their vote to be counted.
- ~ A window of opportunities to vote include online on the school website and via mailed-in ballot (enclosed).

THE SIX CHOICES, in alphabetical order, are:

~ EAGLES: Chief over all the winged creatures. Conveys the powers and messages of the spirit. Man's connection to the divine because it flies higher than any other bird. One of the strongest and most fierce birds of prey. Our national bird. Great connections to the Native Americans. ~ EXPRESS: Fast, accelerated, quick, velocious. Visualize speed. Provides a mascot (train/engine/conductor).

Lots of possibilities for cheers. The book "Track's End" was set in Estelline so there is a basis of history with it. Loved the sound of the train rolling through town. Horn has a sound of power and strength. Goes with "Top of the Line-Estelline." No other school in SD has this mascot.

- ~ PIONEERS: Any mascot has to represent or symbolize South Dakota's rich history. In that history, meaningful pride has to be a cornerstone. With that said, the Pioneers who came to South Dakota in the mid-19th century did so with significant risk, adversity, and danger attached. Their sacrifices are realized today in relation to the creation of foundational elements of South Dakota society: perseverance, faith, and courage. Pioneers would be a great fit for Estelline's future sports heritage. No other school in SD has this mascot.
- ~ RAPTORS: Definition is birds of prey, which includes eagles and red hawks, both popular suggestions. This name takes a modern, forward thinking approach while retaining history of two birds important to Native American culture. Strong and mighty. Many ideas for a mascot. No other school in SD has this mascot.
- ~ RED HAWKS: Keeps "red" in the name. Serves as a cultural bridge and a respectful next step. Native Americans see the hawk as the earth's guardian. Used in their ceremonies and dress with high regard due to their spiritual meaning, power of focus, taking the lead when the time is right, clear vision, higher level perspective. Our school provides insight through quality education. No other school in SD has this mascot.
- ~ RED HORNETS: Keeps "red" in the name. Hornets aggressively guard their nesting sites when threatened and can mobilize the entire nest to sting in defense (unity and teamwork). Stings are dangerous. Lots of possibilities of cheers/logos. Nod to the Bruce Bees. No other school in SD has this mascot.

## ~ All-School Picnic will be held at the Legion Hall ~

At the Estelline Centennial and Homecoming Celebration in 1982, 670 people gathered for an all-school reunion and the idea of an alumni association was launched. The next year, the banquet was attended by 68 people. Overall, the banquet has seen steady numbers since then, but we have received some comments such as, "Is this thing dying out?" or "How about a less formal atmosphere, like a picnic?"

The bylaws of the Alumni Association state that one of our purposes is "to continue and promote a friendly relationship among former students."

At the 2010 annual meeting, the members voted to adopt a resolution to expand membership. During the discussion it was explained that spouses of alumni, as well as parents of current and former students, usually have a great interest in supporting the activities of the Alumni Association. Additional discussion led to a similar desire to include area residents and all individuals who support positive efforts to promote the betterment of the Estelline

School District.

Holding a picnic at the Legion Hall following Saturday's parade will provide a positive change for the association's original intention of "continuing and promoting" relationships among alumni, families, and community members.

Everyone is welcome to attend the picnic following the parade on Saturday, June 16, where we will be serving grilled burgers, salads, beans, chips, ice cream and beverages.

Pre-registration is recommended for those who wish to sit with their classmates so that seating can be reserved for that purpose. There may be some bumps along the way with this new idea, but we will work hard for a smooth transition.
