


#### **ASHLEY SEEKLANDER (2002)**







## ESTELLINE H. S. PLAYS FOOTBALL

Scoreless Game With Brookings Last Saturday Encourages H.S. Team For Next Game

Estelline High School's first football game was played on the home field last Saturday when Brookings High School Seconds came up to show our lads what they didn't know about the game. The day was cold and windy but our youngsters were out immediately after noon and at about two o'clock the preliminaries started with a parade up one side of the street and down the other. The entire school was out, from Chief Wagener down to the first graders, and the noise this crowd made one would think Brookings would be eaten alive. At three o'clock the teams were called onto the field with Art Tuve of Toronto as referee and the skirmish began. The ball was here, there and everywhere but neither team seemed to be able to get near the others goal for a touch down and the first half wound up with a score of nothing to nothing. Spectators were much pleased with the result and when the whistle blew for the second half the lads of both teams went at it harder than ever, but it was the same old story, everybody held tight, and neither side scored. Final result 0 to 0. Considering the fact that it is less than a month ago that Estelline High School began practicing football (some of the players never having seen a football game) the boys are doing remarkably well and we can expect to see them do some real work on the field before the end of the season. The next game will be with Ciark High School at Estelline on Friday afternoon, October 23rd. Come out and see the fun and help the boys win. Coach Rick is doing his part in teaching the boys to play, now let the public do theirs by being at the game and rooting for the team.

## **New Redhawk Traditions Begin At Homecoming Coronation**

Changes have occurred to the EHS homecoming coronation ceremonies over the years, but this year took on new meaning as we transition from the Redmen to the Redhawks. Two new traditions were added to Homecoming this year.

The first new tradition is for seniors to throw something into the bonfire to represent their time in Estelline. Originally each senior was to throw something in the fire and then explain their memory; however, the senior class came up with one item that they all felt represented their time at school Estelline, a Redmen t-shirt. One of the seniors shared these remarks, "The senior class would like to burn this Redmen T-shirt, not to put it in our past but to engrave it forever as one final memory. All of our lives we have been the Redmen, but now we are ready to embrace the change and fly on." It was a very respectful and ceremony and emphasized the students' school spirit.

The "Flight of the Redhawk" is the second new tradition involving students, staff, and community members. After the bonfire, students in grades 6-12 were invited onto the football field. Community members, staff, and family stood outside the fence to symbolize the support system

they provide the students throughout their lifetime. The scoreboard was set at 13 minutes and started winding down as the King and Queen lead the students on a walk around the track, playing music and sharing memories throughout their time in school. This is intended to be a "student bonding" moment, to help our students realize it's almost the end before the end happens. Our hope is to pull them closer together through the schooling process. Students then walked back onto the field, staying there for one minute for each year they had been in school. The 6<sup>th</sup> grade stayed on field for seven minutes, then left the field; 7th graders stayed on the field for eight minutes; and so on for each grade, finally leaving the Seniors on the field alone. They did a class cheer and departed the field.

The pep rally after the parade on Friday afternoon is not a new tradition, but the students wanted the parade reversed to end at the Estelline Care Center, rather than start there. The pep rally was held in front of the nursing home so the residents could enjoy it as well. Thanks to the ENCC dietary department and the residents for baking and decorating 300 sugar cookies for everyone to enjoy after the pep rally!
