TAX LEVY RESOLUTION

Tammy Steckel presented information on the 2004 tax levy. After discussion, a motion was made by Copley, seconded by Rogers to adopt the following resolution.

WHEREAS the Truth in Taxation Act requires that all taxing districts in the State of Illinois determine the estimated amount of taxes necessary to be levied for the year; and

WHEREAS if the estimated amount of taxes necessary to be levied may exceed 105% of the aggregate amount of property taxes extended upon the levy of the preceding year, a public notice

shall be given, and a public hearing shall be held on the District's intent to adopt a tax levy in an amount which is more than 105% of extension for the preceding year.

WHEREAS the aggregate amount of property taxes extended for 2003 was \$7,437,386 and

WHEREAS it is hereby determined that the estimated amount of taxes to be levied for the year 2004 may exceed this amount.

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved by the Board of Education of Community Unit School District No. 100, Counties of Jersey and Greene, State of Illinois as follows:

The aggregate amount of taxes estimated to be levied for the year 2004 may exceed 105% of the taxes extended by the District for the year 2003. Public notice shall be given in The Telegraph and the Jersey County Star and a public hearing will be held in the manner and time prescribed by law.
