<u>Introductions:</u> Mrs. Capener welcomed the council and excused President Layne Sorensen.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Mrs. Capener reviewed and explained the final report from 2017 – 2018. She would like to simplify the budgets this year since there was quite a bit of confusion with money being spread out in so many different budgets last year, see below. She expects that there will be about \$130,000 in our budget for next year. Our greatest academic needs are math, reading and writing.

Other Items:

Attendance - Mrs. Capener asked the council to think of ways we can improve our attendance. She explained in our first trimester about 200 students missed at least 25 days of school. The biggest problem is that House Bill 238 took away the non-attendance punishment for parents. The school has used citizenship as a punishment but they are looking for a better solution.

Graduation Gowns – Mrs. Capener wants graduation to be a formal event for our students. She feels like our students don't get enough of these kind of experiences and wants it to be special. In the High School Principals meeting it was decided that the two high schools would just wear one color at their respective graduations. Josten's announced the change in their graduation meeting with the seniors in October. The decision has been met with some resistance so the school will be holding a vote to decide if the changes will be implemented this year. If no, changes will take place in 2019-20. Mrs. Capener feels that by going to one color the school is showing unity to our community.
