## Bauxite Schools Covid-19 Continuity of Services, ESSER Plan, And Public Input Tool Updated March 2023

## MASKING:

- In the Spring of 2021, masks became optional for Bauxite students and staff.
- o In 22-23, masks still remain optional.

## **VIRTUAL LEARNING:**

Bauxite Schools believes onsite instruction offers the best educational outcomes for students, and as such, the district will have very limited virtual options for students in 21-22 and 22-23. Students who will be virtual must have applied and have been approved to be virtual. All students who did not apply and receive approval to be virtual will be 100% onsite in 2021-2022 and 2022-2023. Attendance and truancy will be recorded and reported as they were prior to the COVID-19 pandemic.

April 2022 Update: The district continues to support onsite instruction. Applications for 22-23 virtual learning must be submitted byMay 1, 2022.

September 2022 Update: The district continues to support onsite instruction. This will most likely be the last year we will offer the virtual option for K-6 students through our district or the Dawson co-op as we have very few K-6 students requiring virtual education.

March 2023 Update: The district continues to support onsite instruction. This will be the last year we will offer the virtual option for K-6 students. Students with health conditions that make onsite learning difficult in grades 7-12 who are able to be successful in a self-paced digital environment may apply for virtual. The district will use Edgenuity for these courses.

**September 2021 Update:** The district surveyed parents, students, and staff regarding masks in September 2021, and the results of the stakeholder surveys were shared with staff in September 2021. The district continues to remain mask optional. Very few students are currently virtual, and those who were allowed to be virtual filled out an application and were approved by a committee for the entire year or semester, depending on grade level.

April 2022: Due to a shortage of substitute teachers, the district hired two paraprofessionals to serve as floater substitutes, as well as two additional interventionists to mitigate learning loss. More information about how the district is spending ESSER Funds can be found in the link below.

September 2022: The district has one paraprofessional at the high school to serve as a floater sub at this time.

March 2023 - The district no longer has a paraprofessional as a floater sub, and subs are difficult to obtain.
