The Executive Women in Agriculture Trailblazer Award honors female producers who are shining examples for their peers. Applications are received from producers nationwide and judged by industry experts. This prestigious award is presented to the candidate who advocates agriculture and represents an innovative farming operation—judged on agricultural advocacy, farm business innovation, and industry or community leadership.

Ruff considers herself blessed to live and work in agriculture. She grew up as a farm girl and loved it. Today, she runs Ruff Farms with her husband, Mark, and three children, Matt (19), Mitchell (16), and Mae (11). The operation includes nearly 4,000 areas of corn, soybean, and wheat; beef cattle; and various ag businesses.

In addition to agriculture, Marcia's extremely passionate about education. "My heart is with kids." As a 4-H advisor for 25 years and a teacher for 27 years, she uses that role to educate and advocate for agriculture and food production. As a female producer, she has broken the stereotype about farming with her students and shown that women can be farmers too.

"You don't have to be the one driving the combine to be more than the farm wife," she says. "There are so many working roles on a farm."
