#### **BULLDOG BLITZ**

Fayetteville High School will be hosting Bulldog Blitz on Tuesday, August 3 and Wednesday, August 4, from 10am-7pm in the FHS Cafeteria. All students and parents are encouraged to attend. On these dates, students and parents will be able to do the following:

#### STUDENT ID CARDS

Student ID cards are **REQUIRED** to be worn by all FHS students during the school day. Freshmen and new students will be distributed an ID card during Bulldog Blitz. All returning students who need a new ID card made will also be able to request one during Bulldog Blitz.

Student IDs are used for the safety of the students and staff in our high school. Student IDs are proximity enabled, which allows students to use them to gain building access at Bulldog Lobby and the Purple Office. Lost or stolen student IDs must be reported to the Principal's Office and replaced. A \$5.00 charge will be assessed for replacement student IDs. If a student is missing their ID they must obtain a temporary student ID for the day from their classroom teacher or purchase a replacement ID for \$5.00

#### **LUNCHTIME PROCEDURES**

Fayetteville High School is a **CLOSED** campus. Students will need to either bring their lunch or plan to eat in the cafeteria or breezeway. Students are **NOT ALLOWED** to eat lunch in the academic buildings. Fayetteville Public Schools offers a variety of tasty and nutritious meals for students. Students and families may access lunch menus and pay online using the school website. **PLEASE NOTE: Students may not have food delivered to school. Parents, guardians, and friends may not drop off food to be delivered to students during the school day.** 

#### **OPEN HOUSE**

Please mark your calendars now to attend the annual Open House Night on Thursday, August 12 from 5:30-7:00pm. Open House will be a drop-in event so families can tour the school and meet Fayetteville High School teachers.

#### **BUS TRANSPORTATION**

Students who ride the bus to school will be **dropped off and picked up** daily in front of the Performing Arts Center (PAC). Should you have any questions about bus transportation, please contact the Transportation Office at 479-444-3095.

If your child would like Zero Hour bus transportation, please contact the Fayetteville Public Schools Transportation Department at 479-444-3095. Please be prepared to provide the following information:

- Student Name
- Grade
- Address

Requests for Zero Hour bus transportation need to be made prior to the start of school by calling the Fayetteville Public Schools Transportation Department at (479) 444-3095. Please note that morning routes have designated collection points with departure times where students must report for their bus stop. These collection points might be schools, businesses, etc. Students and parents will be told where to wait for their bus.

#### STUDENT PARKING

Students who paid for a parking permit prior to leaving in the spring may pick up their parking sticker during Bulldog Blitz. A student ID and valid driver's license are required to pick up the parking sticker. Students who are not able to pick up their sticker during Bulldog Blitz may pick it up on the first day of school in the Phase 3, 1st Floor Office.

# STUDENT DROP OFF/PICK UP

Parents must use Bulldog Boulevard on the north side of the building to pick up students. **NOTE**: Buses pick up and drop off in front of the school by the Performing Arts Center and Arena at the beginning and end of the school day. For safety reasons, and to allow for appropriate flow of traffic, **PLEASE DO NOT** drop students off on MLK Blvd.

# **HOME ACCESS CENTER (HAC)**

Home Access Center (HAC) can be accessed by visiting the school website and clicking on GRADEVIEWER in the top right hand corner of the page. Make certain to select **FAYETTEVILLE SCHOOL DISTRICT**. If you have forgotten your password, click the link "Forgot my Username or Password" at the site. Home Access Center will be turned off for the summer, but will be opened prior to Bulldog Blitz.

Additionally, Fayetteville High School staff worked very hard last year to develop common grading practices by department so that there is equity in grading. These common grading practices can be viewed on the FHS website or by clicking **HERE**.

# PARENT/TEACHER STUDENT ORGANIZATION (PTSO)

Please join the Parent Teacher Student Organization (PTSO) at Fayetteville High School. With your support, PTSO funding provides our teachers with additional materials that are used to enhance learning in the classroom. The PTSO also emails members with detailed information about high school events. Membership is \$20 per family, which includes an electronic directory. #### **NAVIANCE PARENT ACCOUNTS**

One of the foundational pieces of our Advisory program at FHS will be the use of Naviance Student. Naviance Student makes it easier and more engaging than ever for students to answer the four most important questions that shape their future: Who am I? What do I want to be? How will I get there? and How will I succeed? Because we want to provide college, career, and life readiness guidance for ALL students, it is imperative that we have a tool that allows students and parents the opportunity to personalize their plan for high school and beyond.

Students in each grade level will be assigned various tasks to complete in Naviance as they relate to college, career, and life readiness. Time will be given during Advisory to complete these assignments, however, we want to engage you as parents in the process as well. Parents have view-only access to Naviance Student and can request an account with Deanna Easton (deanna.easton@g.fayar.net), FHS Student Programs Coordinator. Ultimately, we want you to know that at FHS, we take college, career, and life readiness very seriously and that this process involves a partnership between FHS staff, students, and parents.

# 40 DEVELOPMENTAL ASSETS & SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL)

The Search Institute (<a href="https://www.search-institute.org">https://www.search-institute.org</a>) has studied Developmental Assets in the lives of millions of young people across the United States and around the world. Research consistently shows that young people from all backgrounds do better when they have a strong foundation of these strengths in their lives. When youth have more assets, they are:

- More likely to thrive now and in the future
- Less likely to engage in a wide range of high-risk behaviors
- More likely to be resilient in the face of challenges

Starting in August, all FHS parents will receive a weekly email highlighting an ASSET OF THE WEEK to use as a conversational point at home. Additionally, a separate email will be sent out periodically to discuss grade level specific SEL lessons that are being delivered during your child's Advisory Time. It is our sincere hope that we can engage you in a partnership to help our kids develop into positive and productive adults by teaching them skills to navigate adulthood.

# **DEVELOPMENTAL ASSET PROFILE (DAP)**

On August 16 and 17, Fayetteville High School will be conducting a survey of our students to determine what social and emotional support they need from our school. The results will help us work together to help young people succeed and thrive at school.

The survey is titled the Developmental Assets Profile (DAP) and more information on the survey can be found <a href="HERE">HERE</a>. The survey focuses on the strengths and supports that youth have and need in their lives. This survey will help our school work with you to ensure that the young people we work with have the opportunities they need to be successful in life. The survey focuses on young people's own perceptions of their strengths. It does not ask more sensitive questions about potential high-risk behaviors.

#### **Overview of Key Points**

- The survey is not a test. It is a survey of your child's experiences and opinions. There are no right or wrong answers.
- There are no consequences if your child chooses not to participate. Students who do not participate will be asked to read or study quietly while the survey is administered.
- The survey will be completed online and will take less than 10 minutes to complete.
- We are requesting that each child uses a unique ID to be able to link two surveys together in order to look at growth in the self-reported strengths and supports of each child. These data will only be made available to school administration and counselors.
- Participation is completely voluntary. You may refuse participation on behalf of your child and your child can skip items if they so choose and end their participation at any time.
- The survey asks about young people's own experiences and ideas as well as some information about themselves (e.g., age, gender, race-ethnicity).
- Other than some possible discomfort with some questions, there are no risks to participating in this survey. Your child will be told of his/her right to skip any question he/she does not want to answer.
- There is no compensation for participating in this survey. However, key overall findings will
  be shared with families and others who are interested in ensuring that young people have
  the supports they need in their lives.

The value of a survey of this kind depends upon the participation of many youth. We hope you will encourage your child to participate. In doing so, they will help strengthen the supports for students at Fayetteville High School.
