Jn 12:24-26 "...but if it dies, it produces many seeds. ²⁵ The man who loves his life will lose it, while the man who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me."

Death is the gateway to life. Jesus' public ministry is coming to an end; He is preparing for the triumphal entry. He uses the kernel of wheat as an example that through death life may abound. It is paradoxical. This paradox is enhanced by those who love their life who will lose it and those who hate their life will keep it for eternity. Again, it contradicts common logic. This should be interpreted as those obedient servants who have died to their own will in order to become servants of Jesus' will and will be ultimately honored by His heavenly Father.
