QUALIFICATIONS:

Occupational therapy education-related services are provided by a professional holding a bachelor's or master's degree in occupational therapy from an accredited school in occupational therapy. The therapist shall maintain certification / licensure as defined by and subject to federal and state laws, policies and regulations. An occupational therapist should have a minimum of two years of experience with a pediatric population. Must hold a Type E Certification from the Colorado Department of Education.

REPORTS TO:

Director of Special Education

JOB GOAL:

To provide education-related Occupational Therapy services for students with disabilities to enhance their potential for learning and facilitate performance skills needed to function within the education system.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Provides occupational therapy evaluations of students with disabilities.
- 2. Develops individual goals and objectives for students, based upon results of the occupational therapy evaluations.
- 3. Incorporates and coordinates a student's occupational therapy goals and objectives into the Individualized Education Program.
- 4. Administers/manages appropriate occupational therapy services as identified through evaluations and defined by the goals and objectives of a student's IEP.
- 5. Provides re-evaluations of students at intervals determined to be educationally and medically appropriate.
- 6. Communicates results of evaluations and reports of occupational therapy students to the educational staff, parents, students and when appropriate and approved, to other professionals and agencies concerned with the student.
- 7. Participates in staff development activities for personnel on request from supervisor.
- 8. Attends staffings and other school meetings when necessary and feasible.
- 9. Maintains supplies, equipment and therapy areas.
- 10. Attends staff, professional and interagency meetings.

- 11. Provides necessary program information for completion of state, federal and agency reports as requested by the Director of Special Education.
- 12. Complies with provisions of the BOCES Special Education Comprehensive Plan and with all procedural safeguards and confidentiality requirements specified in state and federal statues and rules and regulations.
- 13. Provides special/regular education teacher with appropriate skills/tools to be utilized with O.T. students.
- 14. Keeps abreast of new developments in the field.
- 15. Fulfills any other responsibilities as designated by the Director of Special Education.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT: 185 days or as established by the BOCES Board.

EVALUATION: Performance of this job will be evaluated annually in accordance with provisions of the Board's Policy on Evaluation of Professional Staff.
