A regular meeting of the Reef-Sunset Unified School District Board of Trustees was held on this date in the Board/Staff Development Room located at 205 N. Park Ave., Avenal, CA 93204 and live streamed via the district website.

Ms. Padilla, Board President called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m. and the Board convened to closed session. The meeting was reconvened to open session at 6:02 p.m. and Ms. Padilla led the audience in the pledge of allegiance.

Mr. Chavez reported that he attended the AHS

girls basketball game and wished AHS student athletes well. Mr. Chavez also reported that the City rescued some horses. He was grateful to know that the AHS FFA was helping in getting the horses back to good health and wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving. DISCUSSION ITEMS:

- AES / AHS Listening Tour Update Mrs. Barrera Lopez and Mrs. Rizo reported they attended the A. AES Listening tour where parents expressed concerns with severe discipline issues in one of the classrooms. Parents expressed concern for student and staff safety at RSMS as well, due to increased number of student fights. They also expressed concerns with the cafeteria food not being distributed in a timely manner; students left without eating. Ms. Padilla, Mr. Chavez and Miss Macias attended the AHS listening tour. Ms. Padilla reported that the eachers expressed concerns with the numerous fights held in the restrooms. Parents suggested having a full time SRO on campus to help with the de-escalation of fights. They reported on the blatant disrespect of staff by the students. They asked to bring motivational speakers for the students. On a positive note, they reported that the students were loving the psychology class Mrs. Jones teaches. It was also reported that a teacher in 4th grade had 5 non-readers; which was very alarming to the Board members in attendance. Teachers also expressed that they would like to revisit the Kagan skills as they felt they were more engaging. Suggestion was made to provide a place for an anonymous comment box. Ms. Padilla mentioned she liked to engage with the attendees asking them why they are here or part of the district.
- Future Agenda Items Update on school safety. Possibility of sharing the money game with students/staff.
- Superintendent's Closing Remarks Mr. Sánchez reported that he and Mr. Luna were working with Kings County to try to hold mental health programs through our system. He reported that Mr. Luna

was working with Climatec to apply for a grant to obtain electric buses. Finally, Mr. Sánchez reported tha he was working with Chief Nevarez in amending the SRO. Once finalized, he hopes to have a stronger SRO presence at our school sites.
