



MPSDL-A Enrollment Guidelines

Marshall Public Schools will follow these guidelines when considering the placement of a currently enrolled MPS student in the MPSDL-A program

- This distance learning program is overseen by Marshall Public School (MPS) employees
- All MPSDL-A application and process must be completed 10 business days prior to the start of the semester for fall enrollment following the MPS Board of Education approved school calendar. Spring semester applications must be submitted 10 business days prior to the end of the 1st semester.
- Students must commit to a minimum of one full semester of MPSDL-A for an entire semester.
- Students may not return to inseat learning until semester break
- The MPSDL-A program will occur in the student's home at the parent/guardian's direction.
- MPS employees will monitor the students progress and offer support in areas needed by the student
- If a student has been enrolled in distance learning prior to this enrollment and didn't meet requirements, complete the course or had good grades (70%) he/she may be denied the opportunity to be enrolled in the MPSDL-A program.
- All applications start with the building level counselor.
- The building level counselor will gather the team of professionals to review the application and make the determination if the MPSDL-A program is the best option for that student.
- Students who are approved to enroll in the MPSDL-A program and receive special education and/or related services must meet with the IEP team to discuss the student's placement in the MPSDL-A program rather than MPSDL-A to assure IEP requirements are met.
- Students who enroll in the MPSDL-AI program are required to take the state required MAP/EOC assessments administered by MPS as well as any required local assessments.
- School meals/food service can be picked up from a designated school for breakfast and lunch.
- If needed, MPS will provide a computer or wifi access for students enrolling in the MPSDL-A program. Parents will have to sign and follow all technology documents related to use of a MPS device.
- Parents/Students who select MPSDL-A must understand how this may impact the student's MSHSAA or NCAA eligibility.
- It is understood that for continued enrollment the student must have the following
 - Satisfactory course progress throughout the semester
 - Grades of 70% or higher in all courses
 - Participation and satisfactory progress in MPS benchmark assessments (when applicable)
 - If these are not met, then the district has the right to end enrollment and the student will have to return to inseat learning at MPS.
- If acceptable progress is made the parents will have the opportunity to re-enroll for the next semester.
- If the student's enrollment is terminated a removal letter will be sent to the parent, MPSDL-A facilitator and a copy will be placed in the student's school file.
