Gen Sheets provided information pertaining to the Fresh Fruits and Vegetables program regarding Livingston, Valley and Wapiti.

The administrators at Valley, Wapiti, and Glenn Livingston are encouraged to gather feedback from parent leaders about the necessity of the fresh fruit and vegetable program at these respective schools. That feedback will be shared on Sept. 19. A decision on extending the program to all elementary schools will be made at that meeting.

Board chair Simone brought up H.B. 194, possession of firearms by school employees on school property. Individual Board members were asked if they were interested in having a conversation about the new law. The majority of individuals indicated they wanted to discuss H.B. 194.

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City of Cody Police Chief, Chuck Baker, School Resource Officer, Rayna Wortham, and Park County Sheriff, Scott Steward participated in an extensive discussion with board members pertaining to H.B. 194. Much of the conversation was tied back to the sample Wyoming School Boards Association policy. The Wyoming Department of Education (WDE) will also release guidelines for H.B. 194 in mid-September.

Law enforcement were invited to the October 3rd work session to help process and understand the WDE guidelines.

Assistant Superintendent Tim Foley shared information about the new State of Wyoming assessment system, WY-TOPP and the district's decision to discontinue use of the NWEA MAP assessment.

Additional miscellaneous information was also shared with the board.

There being no further business to come before the board, on motion by Tom Keegan, seconded by William Struemke and carried, the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
