St. Mary's High School is located in a residential neighborhood in the heart of Colorado Springs, Colorado. Our 150 students benefit from the educational, cultural, spiritual, and athletic opportunities that are offered by this city.

Faculty

St. Mary's High School has 15 full time and 6 part-time faculty. 78 percent of the faculty hold a master's degree or higher. There is a ratio of one faculty member to 7 students with an average class size of 12 students.

Curriculum

St. Mary's High School is a college preparatory, secondary school with varied programs and courses designed to meet the individual needs and interests of our student population. Core courses in English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, World Language, and Theology are supplemented by a variety of electives, including 5 courses of the national Project Lead The Way STEM program. St. Mary's offers its students courses at three levels (College Preparatory, Honors, Advanced Placement) to ensure their successful transition to higher education while maintaining a level of enrollment that provides optimum opportunities for academic and co-curricular success.
