#### **♦ VOTER ELIGIBILITY**

Anyone who is a United States citizen, at least 18 years of age and a resident of School District 15 for more than 30 days prior to the vote is eligible to register. Eligible voters also include those who have voted in school district elections within the past four years and those who are registered with the Nassau County Board of Elections. It is not required that a voter who registers with the school district for the annual election also be registered with the Nassau County Board of Elections.

#### **◆ VOTER REGISTRATION**

Eligible voters may register in person throughout the school year with Ms. Mohinder Bharaj, District Clerk. Personal Voter Registration will be on Tuesday, May 7th between 4:00 pm and 8:00 pm in the Office of the District Clerk located in Lawrence High School. Two forms of identification will be required. This will only register you for school district elections. It will not register you for general elections. The deadline for personal registration is at 11:00 am on Wednesday, May 8th.

#### **◆ ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATIONS**

Qualified registered voters may obtain applications for absentee ballots from the District Clerk or download one from the website. Applications must be received at least 7 days before the vote if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. Absentee ballots are automatically sent to residents who are qualified voters whose registration records have been marked "permanently disabled" by the Board of Elections.

#### WHAT IS ON THE BALLOT?

#### **◆ PROPOSITION NO. 1: SCHOOL BUDGET**

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York, be authorized to expend the sum of **One Hundred Two Million Four Hundred Forty Nine Thousand Two Hundred Eighty One Dollars (\$102,449,281)** for the fiscal year 2019-2020, and is further authorized to levy the necessary tax for the above purpose upon the taxable property of the School District, after first deducting the monies available from State aid and other sources.

#### **◆ PROPOSITION NO. 2: LIBRARY BUDGET**

RESOLVED, that the sum of **Three Million Fifty Five Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy Seven Dollars** (\$3,055,877) be appropriated for the Peninsula Public Library for the fiscal year 2019-2020 and that said amount be raised by tax upon the taxable property of the Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York, pursuant to § 259 of the Education Law, and be levied and collected in the same manner as are other general taxes, after first deducting the monies available from State aid and other sources.

#### **→** PROPOSITION NO. 3: TRANSFER OF FUNDS FOR 2018-2019 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York be authorized to transfer the maximum estimated amount of Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) of unexpended, unreserved funds to the Capital Reserve Fund, established by the voters on April 1, 2015, to construct improvements and renovations during the 2018-2019 school year, which improvements consist of Lawrence High School Sports and Athletics Facilities Renovation, Broadway Campus Air Conditioning Installation, Broadway Campus Corridor Renovation and Locker Replacement, Broadway Campus Classroom Renovations with Door & Hardware Replacement, District-Wide Security Improvements, High School and Broadway Campus Heating, Ventilation and Air conditioning Improvements, and other improvements and costs incidental thereto.

#### **→ PROPOSITION NO. 4: TRANSFER OF FUNDS FOR 2019-2020 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE**

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York be authorized to transfer the maximum estimated amount of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) of unexpended, unreserved funds to the Capital Reserve Fund, established by the voters on April 1, 2015, to construct improvements and renovations during the 2019-2020 school year, which improvements consist of Broadway Campus Sports and Athletics Facilities Renovation, High School Window Replacement, High School Library Renovation, Broadway Campus Cafeteria with Kitchen and Toilet Room Renovations, High School and Broadway Campus HVAC Improvements, and other improvements and costs incidental thereto.

#### ◆ PROPOSITION NO. 5: TRANSFER OF FUNDS FOR FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) PROJECTS

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York be authorized to transfer the maximum estimated amount of **Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000)** of unexpended, unreserved funds and undesignated capital to the Capital Reserve Fund, established by the voters on April 1, 2015, for FEMA projects and other improvements and costs incidental thereto.

- → SCHOOL BOARD TRUSTEE: To elect two (2) trustees of the Board of Education for a three (3) year term commencing July 1, 2019, and ending on June 30, 2022.
- ◆ LIBRARY BOARD TRUSTEE: To elect one (1) trustee of the Peninsula Public Library for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2019 and ending on June 30, 2024.
