VOTING GUIDELINES

VOTER ELIGIBILITY

All voters must be United States citizens, 18 years old or older, and a resident of School District 15 for at least thirty days prior to the vote. In addition, a resident must be registered either with the school district or with the Nassau County Board of Elections. If you have voted in either a school district election within the past year or a local general election anytime in the past four years, you are already registered. If you are not already registered with either, you may register with the County by mail or in person.

WHAT IS ON THE BALLOT?

- PROPOSITION NO. 1: RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York is authorized to expend the sum of \$93,000,598 during the 2013–2014 School Year, and is further authorized to levy the necessary tax for the above purpose upon the taxable property of the School District, after first deducting the monies available for state aid and other sources.
- PROPOSITION NO.2: RESOVLED, that the sum of \$2,774,375 be appropriated for library purposes for the Peninsula Public Library, and that said amount be raised by tax upon the taxable property of the Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, pursuant to § 259 of the Education Law, and be levied and collected in the same manner as are general taxes, after first deducting the monies available from state aid and other sources.
- **BOARD OF EDUCATION TRUSTEES**. To elect three (3) members of the Board of Education for a three (3) year term commencing July 1, 2013, and ending on June 30, 2016.
- **PENINSULA PUBLIC LIBRARY TRUSTEE**. To elect one (1) trustee of the Peninsula Public Library for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2013 and ending on June 30, 2018.
