VOTING GUIDELINES

Residents may visit the **Budget Vote/Election Information** page located on our website, Lawrence.org for in depth information. The link is located on the left of the home page under the blue translation widget. There are links that will enable residents to check their voter registration status, polling locations along with absentee ballot information.

VOTER ELIGIBILITY

Anyone who is a United States citizen, at least 18 years of age, and a resident of School District 15 for more than 30 days prior to the vote is eligible to register. Eligible voters also include those who have voted in school district elections within the past four years and those who are registered with the Nassau County Board of Elections. It is not required that a voter who registers with the school district for the annual election also be registered with the Nassau County Board of Elections.

VOTER REGISTRATION

Eligible voters may register in person throughout the school year with the District Clerk. Personal Voter Registration will be on Tuesday, May 3rd between 4 and 8 pm in the Lawrence Middle School lobby. Two forms of identification will be required. This will only register you for the school district election. It will not register you for the general elections. The deadline for personal registration is at 11 am on Wednesday, May 4th.

Residents may also register by mail to be eligible to vote for all elections by downloading a New York State Voter Registration Form from the Nassau County Board of Elections website: www.co.nassau.ny.us/ boe or the NYS website: www.elections.ny.gov. Your mailed registration form must be received by the Nassau County Board of Elections by May 4th.

ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATIONS

Qualified registered voters can obtain applications for absentee ballots from the District Clerk or download one from the website. Applications must be received at least 7 days before the vote if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. Absentee ballots are automatically sent to residents who are qualified voters whose registration records have been marked "permanently disabled" by the Board of Elections.

WHAT IS ON THE BALLOT?

• PROPOSITION NO. 1: 2016–2017 SCHOOL BUDGET

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York is authorized to expend the sum of \$99,561,935 during the 2016-2017 School Year, and is further authorized to levy the necessary tax for the above purpose upon the taxable property of the School District, after first deducting the monies available for state aid and other sources.

PROPOSITION NO. 2: 2016–2017 LIBRARY BUDGET

RESOVLED, that the sum of \$2,888,510 be appropriated for library purposes for the Peninsula Public Library, and that said amount be raised by tax upon the taxable property of the Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, pursuant to § 259 of the Education Law, and be levied and collected in the same manner as are general taxes, after first deducting the monies available from state aid and other sources.

PROPOSITION NO. 3: TRANSFER OF FUNDS FOR 2015–2016 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York be authorized to transfer up to One Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,800,000) of unexpended, unreserved funds to the Capital Reserve Fund to construct improvements to Lawrence High School during the 2015-2016 school year, which improvements include: renovation of the cafeteria, asbestos removal, installation of HVAC systems, replacement of interior doors, renovation of science laboratory rooms, and other improvements and costs incidental thereto.

PROPOSITION NO. 4: TRANSFER OF FUNDS FOR 2016–2017 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York be authorized to transfer up to Three Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,300,000) of unexpended, unreserved funds to the Capital Reserve Fund to construct improvements to school buildings during the 2016-2017 school year, which improvements include: auditorium renovations at Lawrence Middle School at Broadway Campus and Lawrence High School, repair of cupolas, renovation of bleachers at Lawrence High School, repair and renovation of the exterior façade of the auditorium at Broadway Campus, installation of an ADA-compliant elevator at Lawrence High School, exterior paving at Broadway Campus, and other improvements and costs incidental thereto.

• BOARD OF EDUCATION TRUSTEES

To elect three (3) trustees of the Board of Education for a three (3) year term commencing July 1, 2016, and ending on June 30, 2019.

• PUBLIC LIBRARY TRUSTEE

To elect one (1) trustee of the Public Library for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2016 and ending on June 30, 2021.
