Dear Residents,

Based on a year to year budget increase of zero percent, the Board of Education has adopted a budget of \$93.1 million.

The administration was charged with constructing a budget that created efficiencies, enhanced programs, and maintained a flat budget. Program enhancements include:

- 1. A new Building Trades Vocational Program
- 2. A University Partnership for Universal Pre-K
- 3. S.A.T. Prep for all high school students
- 4. Increased Instructional Time at the High School
- 5. Upgrades in Technology
- 6. Middle School Science Projects Enrichment Program
- 7. Enhanced security systems

Due to increases in salaries and benefits and reductions in state and federal aid, the proposed budget, with a zero percent increase, reflects over \$5 million in cost savings. The largest decrease of \$2.1 million is in the area of salaries and benefits. The reductions in personnel were achieved as a result of attrition through retirements and realignment and redeployment of personnel.

Following the sale of the Number One School for \$29.1 million, the Board allocated \$17 million for capital improvements to the schools in the District and has judiciously applied portions of the remainder of the proceeds to reduce the burden of taxes on all community residents.

In the past five years, the tax levy has grown by less than 1% despite cost pressures primarily driven by contractual salary and benefit increases for District personnel. Nevertheless, we have worked hard to limit our expense growth and, as a result, the six year average budget increase is less than .5%, including the adopted 2012-2013 Budget.

We now educate approximately 3,060 children from pre-school (age four) to twelfth grade, as well as to provide services and support to the nearly 4,400 resident students in attendance in nonpublic schools. Such services are primarily comprised of busing, textbooks, and special education of all our students. We have a significant number of children eligible for free and reduced lunch, an indicator of poverty and are only one of two districts on Long Island that operates a Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program.

Our commitment as trustees and our track record of managing the District is one that we sincerely hope has gained your trust and confidence. Please do not forget to vote on May 15th.

VOTING GUIDELINES

VOTER ELIGIBILITY

Anyone who is a citizen, at least 18 years of age, and a Lawrence School District #15 resident for more than 30 days is eligible to register. Those residents who have voted in one or more school, state, or national elections during the last four years are automatically registered and eligible to vote on Tuesday, May 15, 2012.

VOTER REGISTRATION

For information regarding voter registration, please contact Ms. Mohinder Bharaj, District Clerk, at 295-7032 during school hours. Personal Registration Day will be on Wednesday, May 2, 2012 from 4 PM – 8 PM at the Lawrence Middle School. Two forms of identification will be required. Until Friday, May 4, 2012, those who still wish to register can do so in the Clerk's office at the Lawrence Middle School, 195 Broadway, Lawrence between 9 AM – 11 AM. This is the deadline for personal registration in School District 15.

ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATIONS

Applications for absentee ballots may be obtained by writing or calling the District Clerk, Lawrence Public Schools, P.O. Box 477, Lawrence, New York 11559, telephone 295-7032, or picked up from the Clerk's office during school hours. Residents may also download an absentee ballot application by visiting www.lawrence.org. Applications must be received by May 8, 2012 if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter.

WHAT IS ON THE BALLOT?

- PROPOSITION NO. 1: RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, Town of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York is authorized to expend the sum of \$93,155,150 during the 2012–2013 School Year, and is further authorized to levy the necessary tax for the above purpose upon the taxable property of the School District, after first deducting the monies available for state aid and other sources.
- PROPOSITION NO.2: RESOVLED, that the sum of \$2,720,285 be appropriated for library purposes for the Peninsula Public Library, and that said amount be raised by tax upon the taxable property of the Lawrence Union Free School District No. 15, pursuant to § 259 of the Education Law, and be levied and collected in the same manner as are general taxes, after first deducting the monies available from state aid and other sources.
- **BOARD OF EDUCATION TRUSTEES**. To elect two (2) members of the Board of Education for a three (3) year term commencing July 1, 2012, and ending on June 30, 2015.
- **PENINSULA PUBLIC LIBRARY TRUSTEE**. To elect one (1) trustee of the Peninsula Public Library for a five (5) year term commencing July 1, 2012 and ending on June 30, 2017.
