On Tuesday, February 13th, the following students participated in the AT&T Aspire Mentoring Academy sponsored by Junior Achievement:



### **The Carter Awards**



92 years ago, Dr. Carter G. Woodson, an educator and historian, founded what was called Negro History Week. It was celebrated in February because of Fredrick Douglass' and Abraham Lincoln's birthdays. As part of America's Bicentennial in 1976, it was changed from Negro History Week to Black History Month. Today, we put forth significant effort to highlight the achievements, and sometimes, unrecognized and unknown achievements, during February.

The Carter Awards is an English 9 project in which students were assigned a category, chose a nominee, and then created a nomination package that included: a 4-5 page research paper, an image gallery, a video gallery, and an acceptance speech from the point of view of their nominee. The over 500 votes from the Google form combined with the student's earned points determined today's winners. This project totaled over 500 points, and Mrs. Savage and her student teacher, "Miss M," helped to put together a show to honor these students and the talents of all ECHS students through dance, step, poetry and song.


### R.Y.L.A. Conference

Kasha Hartz and Taylor Gillis-Hammond attended the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) in Ocean City, Maryland February 16 -18. Kasha and Taylor are members of ECHS' Interact Club, which is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Dover. Here is the trip from their point of view:

Our trip to RYLA provided us with a weekend of incredibly motivating and inspiring speakers and activities. On our first night at RYLA, we were put into groups. These groups were the people that we had created our community service project with. On Friday night, we were also able to provide 10,000 meals to children and their families in Africa by packaging meals filled with rice and other nutrients! On Saturday we were introduced to two people who had created community service projects that deeply impacted their communities. The first project was "The inspire project" which is a social media based project that allows teenagers to have a safe space to talk about how their feeling and be motivated by positivity. The other project was a food pantry that the young woman had started inside of her school!

On Saturday, we also participated in a team building activity where we had to build a contraption that would protect an egg from cracking while being dropped from the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd floors of the hotel. Despite the look on Taylor's face, our team was successful and our egg did not crack. On Sunday, we presented our community service project idea to the other groups as well as, listened to their ideas. At the end of the presentations, we all voted for the best project. The project that was voted the best was able to make a \$500 donation to the charity of the group's choice. Even though our group did not win, we weren't too upset, because we knew the money was going to a good cause.

The RYLA conference helped us gain an understanding of the importance of giving back to the community and helping others who are not as fortunate to have guaranteed access to things like clean water, free education, clean clothes everyday, etc. We would love to go again next year!

Congratulations to the 183 students who were college ready for the 3rd MP interim. They were treated to a Valentine's Day Cupcake Bar with all the fixins!




