What is the flu?

Flu: Important Facts to Know

Influenza (flu) is an infection of the nose, throat and lungs caused by the influenza virus. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. Children younger than 5 years old, but especially under the age of 2, and children and adolescents with health conditions are at greater risk of serious flu complications. These flu complications can result in hospital stays and even death. The best way to prevent the flu each year is to get a flu vaccine.

What are symptoms of the flu?

Symptoms of the flu can include fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills, fatigue, and sometimes vomiting and diarrhea. It is important to note that those with the flu do not need to run a fever.

What are flu complications?

Most people who get the flu will recover in a few days to less than 2 weeks, but some may develop complications as a result of the flu, some of which can be life threatening and result in death. Pneumonia, bronchitis, sinus and ear infections are 3 examples of complication from the flu. The flu can also make chronic health conditions worse. For example, people with asthma may experience asthma attacks while they have the flu.

How to Prevent the Flu?

Most important factor in preventing the flu is getting a flu vaccine each year in the fall. Avoid close contact with those that are ill. Wash hands often with soap and water or use alcohol based sanitizer. If using sanitizer, wash hands every third or fourth use of sanitizer. Have your child avoid touching his/her eyes, nose, mouth and use a tissue or elbow to cough or sneeze in. Keep surfaces in the home and toys clean and disinfected each day. Have a plan if your child should become ill.

What can I do if my child get sick?

Call or take child to the doctor if they develop flu-like symptoms. The doctor may want to begin anti-viral drugs as quickly as possible. Anti-viral medications are prescription medications that fight against the flu in your body. They will not cure the flu, but will decrease its intensity. Keep your child at home until they are fever free for 24 hours without use of Tylenol or other medication to keep temperature down. Make sure your child gets plenty of rest and drinks clear fluids (water, broth, sports drinks, and electrolyte beverages, to keep from becoming dehydrated. Remember, Aspirin should not be given to children who have the flu.

When can my child go back to school?

Your child should stay home for 24 hours past last symptoms of the flu. They should be fever free for 24 hours without the use of Tylenol or Motrin. Remember a fever is determined as 100.1 degrees.

Is the Flu vaccine safe for my child? Should I vaccinate my child with the Flu Vaccine?

Yes. The flu vaccine is safe for everyone unless you are allergic to eggs. There is an egg free version of the flu vaccine, you just need to ask for it. The flu vaccine is your child's only protection from not getting the flu or getting a reduced intensity of the flu. It is recommended for all ages from 6 months to the elderly. It is especially recommended for pregnant individuals. Be sure everyone in your household gets vaccinated against the flu.

Genius Hour



Genius Hour is an opportunity for students to have voice and choice regarding their education. Students in Mrs. Savage's English 9 classes selected their topic of interest, then wrote a four-page research paper on that subject. The culminating activity was a vendor-style presentation day where students served as experts on their topic for the entire Freshman class, outside visitors, and parents. Visitors were asked to evaluate the students, and those evaluations were part of their final grade for the project.




Chart Talk





Students in Mr. Testa's Civics classes participated in "chart talk." Groups of students videotaped constitution readings. Students were given a question or opinion statement and placed it in the center of a sheet of chart paper. They then had a "conversation" about the question/statement and placed anything they would say in bubbles around the center. As the groups "talked" the sheet filled up and they ended up capturing the whole content-rich conversation. The first rule of chart talk is "We do not talk during chart talk." That way they are forced to read the responses of others before adding their own thoughts.

Schoology Tips for Parents

Parent's Guide to Schoology

Welcome to Schoology! Below you will find an explanation of the different areas of your Schoology account. For more in-depth guidance on specific Schoology features, check out the Help Center at support.schoology.com.

What Is Schoology?

Teachers use Schoology to post their classroom materials online; provide a safe forum for students to discuss their ideas and collaborate on projects; and to assign and collect homework electronically. It helps students stay organized and it keeps the class connected. A Schoology Parent Account gives you access to: The classes your child is enrolled in, your child's upcoming assignments, school and class announcements. Schoology makes it easy for parents to stay involved in their children's education.

Navigating Schoology

Your Account

After logging in, you can see the top navigation bar from anywhere in Schoology. On the left side of the bar, you can navigate to the four main areas of Schoology: Home, Courses, Groups, and Resources. Clicking **Home** always brings you back to your home page, the landing page you see when you log in. This is where you see your **Recent Activity** feed.

Messages & Notifications

When you are in your own Schoology account (not your child's), icons for **messages**, **connections** and **notifications** display in the top navigation bar, on the right; you can also click your name to go to your own **Personal Profile.** Any time someone sends you a message, or does something that pertains to you or your child's school, it's easily accessible in the top-right corner of your screen. Everything is chronologically ordered and clickable to make managing them simple.

Viewing Your Child's Activity

Click on the arrow in the upper-right corner of your account and select your child's name to view his or her activity.

- 1. Use the left menu to quickly view specific information about your child's Schoology activity:
- a. **Summary**: Click to see an overview of your child's courses and grades (**Enrollments** in the center column), or notifications about grades on individual assignments (**Student Activity** in the middle column).
- b. **Grades/Attendance:** Review your child's grades and attendance for all courses.
- c. **Mastery**: If your child's school aligns materials to standard and learning objectives, you can check your child's progress in this area.
- d. Calendar: Click to view a calendar of past and upcoming events and assignments. Events and assignments in the near future are also listed in the Upcoming column on the right.
- e. **Messages**: View your own messages on Schoology. Messages to your child are private and are not viewable from this area.
- 2. Select **Enrollments** in the center column to see a list of the courses your child is currently enrolled in, along with his or her grade. If the teacher or administrator has chosen not to display the grade while the course is in progress, you will see a blank value (as in the grade column for U.S. History, above). Click on an individual course to see grades received on assignments, tests, and discussions from that course.
- 3. Here, you can see a list of your child's Schoology **Groups**. Groups can be used for a variety of activities, from school projects to extracurricular teams and clubs.
- 4. The Recent Grades/Attendance section displays your child's recent grade and attendance information.
- 5. The **Overdue** section displays a list of course materials your child did not turn in by the due date.
- 6. The **Upcoming** section displays a list of your child's upcoming assignments and events.
