

















# **CONTINUED LEARNING**

# KINDERGARTEN & 2020-21 SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

Beginning with the 2020-21 school year, students will register online to attend PCS, beginning with new Kindergarten enrollees, the Class of 2033.

A parent/guardian enrolling a new student will be asked to upload the following: Property deed, rental agreement or recent tax statement, utility bill (city water/sewer, electric, or gas) dated within 30 days that includes the name of the parent/guardian.

We will also use this process for parents/guardians to update their student's information. Each year. beginning in July, parents of each and every student will be asked to update data. Even if there are no changes you will be asked to log-in to Infinite Campus and acknowledge that there are no changes. This will allow us to have updated information prior to school starting. We will no longer be sending home the demographic sheets at the beginning of the school year.

Parents updating their child's information will need to supply the above mentioned documents if anything has changed since the previous school year such as custody or residency.

We will be sending out more information as we get closer to rolling this out.




