Chenal Elementary will communicate with parents in the following ways to increase parent involvement and to support classroom instruction by:

- Distributing a monthly newsletter to parents that is developed with participation of the
 parent-school organization, principal, staff, and parent volunteers. It includes school news and a
 calendar of school activities. Flyers are distributed on an as needed basis promoting school

- Virtual Tour created for new families to become familiar with the building.
- Teachers will contact parents as needed on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress.
- The school will use the school handbook, school website, and parent orientation meetings to display information regarding the school-wide plan.
- The school will communicate routinely with parents using Facebook, school-wide call-outs, school website, PCSSD Mobile App, and daily communication folders.

- The teachers will be sending home a communication folder containing student papers and work samples periodically. Parents will be asked to sign the folder and send it back to school. Grades 3-5 will use an "agenda" notebook for two way communication with parent and teacher.
- The classroom teachers provide parents with an interim report every 4 ½ weeks, and report cards every 9 weeks with information regarding their child's academic progress.
- Two parent teacher conference days are scheduled per school year to discuss student's progress, standardized test scores, and an explanation of the interventions teachers are using to assist the child in reaching achievement goals. Parents will be asked to engage in discussion of how they can support these efforts. Conferences for this school year are scheduled for September 15 & 22 and February 9 & 16.
- Parents who wish to volunteer, may communicate with other parents and staff at Chenal through email, school status, or by calling.

How will your school engage parents in the evaluation of your parental involvement efforts?

• The school will engage parents in the annual evaluation of parental involvement efforts through a comprehensive survey filled out by teachers, parents, and school staff. While collecting evidence about satisfaction with the program the survey will also collect specific information (1) growth in number of parents participating in workshops and meetings; (2) specific needs of parents; (3) effectiveness of specific strategies; and (4) engagement of parents in activities to support student academic growth.

Planned Activities/ Meetings

Each year before school begins, the school will host a Back-to-School Night, which will serve as a time for parents to come to school and meet their child's teacher. This time is also used for parents to sign up for PTO Committees, PALS Volunteer Program, and meet other Chenal parents.

Chenal Elementary will host an Open House in August, as an opportunity for parents and community members to learn more about each teacher's classroom routines and academic expectations.

Chenal Elementary will involve parents on school improvement committees and ask parents to serve on curricular and instructional review committees. Our PTO will foster parental and community involvement within the school.

Parent Information Center

The Parent Resource Center is located in the front office upon entering the school. This area will house information, such as pamphlets, brochures, videos, books, and web-page addresses to promote and support responsible parenting.

Counseling Schoology

The counseling department will have a tab on the website that gives helpful tips and resources for responsible parenting. There are also resources available on common topics for parents to review. These topics include anxiety, ADHD, problem solving, grief, anger, divorce, etc.

School Visitation

Visitors are required to sign in and receive a visitor's pass. These passes are available in the office. Please sign in AND out so that our volunteer logs can be more accurate.
