

Johnson Co. Schools' Educator Named Administrator of the Year

Frankfort, Ky. – Chris Pierce, principal of Flat Gap Elementary School in the Johnson County School system, has been named the building-level Administrator of the Year by the Kentucky Association of School Administrators.
