Health Requirements

Vision Examination

As of January 1, 2008, the State of Illinois has required that all students entering kin dergarten or entering school for the first time from out of state shall have an eye examination before October 15 of the school year.

Dental Examination

As of July 1, 2005, a new State of Illinois law went into effect requiring that all stude nts in kindergarten, second and sixth grades have an oral health examination perfor med by a licensed dentist. The exam must be performed sometime between June 1st and May 15th and must be submitted no later than May 20th of their K, 2 or 6th school year.

Physical Examination

A physical examination is required for entrance into Preschool, Kindergarten, 6th grade, and/or when transferring from an out of state school. The health history portion of the physical examination from must be completed and signed by the parent in order for the physical to be valid. The exam must be dated within one year prior to the date the student enters school.

Physical examinations are acquired through your primary medical provider. If you do not have a primary medical provider you may contact your school nurse or the Cook County Health Department for referrals to local health clinics.

Immunization Requirements

For Preschool

Diptheria, Pertussis, Tetanus: 4 doses of DTP/DtaP

Polio: minimum of 3 doses of IPV

Measles: 1 dose received on or after 1st birthday

(usually given as MMR)

Mumps: 1 dose received on or after 1st birthday

(usually given as MMR)

Rubella: dose received on or after 1st birthday

(usually given as MMR)

Hepatitis B: 3 doses received at proper intervals

Heamophilus Influenza B: 3 doses received at proper intervals

Chicken Pox: Varicella immunization is required prior to

entrance to preschool: 1 dose on or after the

1st birthday

For Kindergarten - 5th grade

Diptheria, Pertussis, Tetanus: 4 or more doses of DTP/DtaP with the last dose

qualifying as a booster and received on or after

the 4th birthday

Polio: 4 or more doses of IPV with the last dose

qualifying as a booster and received

on or after 4th birthday

Measles: 2 doses: the first dose received on or after the 1st

birthday; second dose no less than 28 days later

(usually given as MMR)

Mumps: 2 doses: the first dose received on or after the 1st

birthday; second dose no less than 28 days later

(usually given as MMR)

Rubella: 2 doses: the first dose received on or after the 1st

birthday; second dose no less than 28 days later

(usually given as MMR)

Hepatitis B: No requirements until entering 6th grade

Haemophilus Influenza B: HIB immunization not required after 5th

birthday

Chicken Pox: 2 doses: the first dose received on or after the 1st

birthday; second dose no less than 28 days later

For Grades 6-8

Meningitis:

Diptheria, Pertussis, Tetanus:	4 or more doses of DTP/DtaP or Td with the last dose qualifying as a booster and received on or the $4^{\rm th}$ birthday
Tdap:	1 dose required before entering 6 th grade
Polio:	3 doses or more of IPV with the last dose qualifying as a booster and received on or after the 4^{th} birthday
Measles:	2 doses: the first dose received on or after the 1 st birthday; second dose no less than 28 days later (usually given as MMR)
Mumps:	2 doses: the first dose received on or after the 1st birthday; second dose no less than 28 days later (usually given as MMR)
Rubella:	2 doses: the first dose received on or after the 1st birthday; second dose no less than 28 days later (usually given as MMR)
Hepatitis:	3 doses received at proper intervals
Chicken Pox:	2 doses: the first dose received on or after the $1^{\rm st}$ birthday; second dose no less than 28 days later
