
Burr Oak Community Schools strives to provide a safe and nurturing environment in which all students are able to be literate in all subjects through:

#### **Bus Rules**

Buses will stop to pick up or discharge students only at designated stops approved by the as approved by the transportation supervisor or superintendent. The routing of school buses is planned so that the transportation of its pupils will be adequately met. A map of the district can be found in the office.

All pupils must behave properly as a passenger on the bus.

- Students transported by the bus are under the authority of the bus driver.
- Persistent disorderly conduct on the bus shall be suffi-

- cient reason for a pupil to be denied school transportation
- The driver of any school bus shall be held responsible for the conduct of the pupils being transported.
- A school bus shall not be put into motion until all pupils are seated.
- The use of tobacco, drugs, or any vaping device is prohibited and will be subject to both state and school policy.
- No intoxicating liquor shall be transported at any time.
- The use of lighters/matches is prohibited.
- No glass bottles on the bus.
- No spray of any kind on the bus.
- No animals on the bus.
- No weapon of any kind on the bus
- No student shall occupy a position on the bus that will hinder the vision of the bus driver
- Fighting on the bus is strictly prohibited
- Profane language will not be permitted or tolerated.
- All student are to remain seated while the bus is in motion.
- Nothing shall be thrown within or from the bus at any time.
- No student shall be allowed to get off the bus except at home, or location at which he/she is scheduled to get off, without special permissions from parent/ guardian. Student must present letter to office then to bus driver.
- For students in grades K-3 being transported to and from school on the bus, an adult or older child(4th grade and up), must be present in order for student to get dropped off. If no one is present and alternative plans have not been made, the student will be brought back to the student and it will be the parent/guardians will be responsible to transport the child home on that day. If the student is brought back to the school more than once in a two week period, child protective services will be notified.

#### 2261.02 - TITLE I - PARENT'S RIGHT TO KNOW

In accordance with the requirement of Section 1111 of Title I, for each school receiving Title I funds, the Superintendent shall make sure that all parents of students in that school are notified that they may request, and the District will provide the following information on the student's classroom teachers:

- whether the teacher(s) have met the State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas they are teaching
- whether the teacher(s) is teaching under any emergency or provisional status in which the State requirements have been waived
- the undergraduate major of the teacher(s) and the area of study and any certificates for any graduate degrees earned
- the qualifications of any paraprofessionals providing services to their child(ren)

In addition, the parents **shall** be provided:

- information on the level of achievement of their child(ren) on the required State academic assessments;
- timely notice if the student is assigned to a teacher who is not "highly qualified' as required, or if the student is taught for more than four (4) weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.

The notices and information shall be provided in an understandable format, and to the extent possible, in a language the parent(s) understand.

#### Notification Of Rights Under FERPA For Elementary And Secondary Schools

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students who are 18 years of age or older ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are: The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days after the day the [Name of school Burr Oak Community Schools receives a request for access.

Parents or eligible students who wish to inspect their child's or their education records should submit to the school principal [or appropriate school official] a written request that identifies the records they wish to inspect. The school official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

1)The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA.

Parents or eligible students who wish to ask the [School] to amend their child's or their education record should write the school principal [or appropriate school official], clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it should be changed. If the school decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the school will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

2)The right to provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information (PII) from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. The criteria for determining who constitutes a school official and what constitutes a legitimate educational interest must be set forth in the school's or school district's annual notification for FERPA rights. A school official typically includes a person employed by the school or school district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel) or a person serving on the school board.

A school official also may include a volunteer, contractor, or consultant who, while not employed by the school, performs an institutional service or function for which the school would otherwise use its own employees and who is under the direct control of the school with respect to the use and maintenance of PII from education records, such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist; a parent or student volunteering to serve on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee; or a parent, student, or other volunteer assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official typically has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

3)The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by Burr Oak Community Schools to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA are

#### NONDISCRIMMINATION

- D. Any person may also contact the Office for Civil Rights, U.S. Department of Education ("OCR"), by email at OCR.Cleveland@ed.gov, by telephone at (216) 522-4970, or by fax at (216) 522-2573 regarding compliance with the regulations implementing Title VI, Title IX, Section 504, or any other applicable laws for which OCR has jurisdiction.
- E. A contract to which the District is a party shall be read to include a covenant by the contractor and its subcontractors not to discriminate against an employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment, or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of race, color, national origin, religion, sex (including pregnancy, gender identity, or sexual orientation), age, height, weight, and marital status.
