A committee will review results of parent feedback and create a plan of action to address concerns. Surveys will be sent and analyzed by the end of the first quarter.

An Annual Title I Meeting will be held at the start of the school year prior to September 1, 2021. During this meeting, materials will be used to inform parents of the requirements of Title 1, the school's participation and parents' rights will be distributed.

- 1. Parents receive Family Kits, in which the family engagement policy is described in detail. The Family Kits are translated for those needing Spanish. Included in the kit are: Contact information for the Parent Involvement Coordinator, schedule of activities for the year, methods for meaningful two-way communication and ways for parents to get involved.
- 2. Parents receive a monthly calendar announcing ways they can be involved through parent programs, meetings, etc. In addition, individual fliers, the use of Facebook, and the school sign are ways we communicate to parents about upcoming events. Teachers use multiple social media platforms (DoJo, Remind 101, etc.) to communicate information to parents.
- 3. Parents receive weekly newsletters from classroom teachers announcing classroom events. Most of these newsletters are translated into Spanish. In addition, teachers use a form of home communication including DoJo

or Remind101 that parents can choose the language in which the program sends their messages.

- 6. Monthly parent meetings will be held by the principal and staff to discuss relevant topics including parenting, social media and students, academic achievement, and other hot topics that parents feel would create a stronger partnership between school and home. Meetings will be scheduled for the months of September, October, December, January, February and April.
- 7. Signatures of parents will be acquired upon receipt of required information and meetings will be offered at various times (i.e. one during the day and one in the evening) to accommodate varying parent schedules. Online information will be available as well. Sign in sheets will verify receipt of the information. A parent-friendly summary/explanation of the parent and family engagement plan will be placed online and as a supplement to the student handbook

- Parents will be given a copy of the Parent Compact by September 1, 2021 in English and Spanish
- Parents have opportunities throughout the year through P/T Conferences and various family activities and parent meetings to learn how to help their child at home reinforce literacy skills. As much as possible, interpreters are present.
- Teachers frequently send resources and/or tips to help parents better understand how to help their child with homework and give parenting tips on supporting academic tasks in English and Spanish.
- OHE will host monthly events during 2021-2022 provided it is safe due to coronavirus including O'Down and Book Bingo. During these monthly meetings we will specifically provide parents with tips and support for supporting their children in reading development in both English and Spanish. We will also provide guest speakers, hands on activities and other methods of support to educate and support parents in their role of parenting elementary children.
- A minimum of two P/T Conferences will be held to provide feedback to parents about student progress. Tips to support students will be available to the parents from staff. Interpreters are present.
- The Parent Center is available to parents who need additional materials to support their child at home.
- Additional meetings will be held if students are struggling in academics to ensure parents have an opportunity to be a part of the plan to improve their child's academics. These meetings may be held with the classroom teacher, other staff, or through an SST committee with interpreters present as needed.
- A survey will be provided to parents during the first quarter of the school year 2021-2022 to determine possible topics of monthly meetings and to determine areas of interest parents would like to volunteer.

Russellville School District annually receives more than \$500,000 in Title I allocation. The district reserves

annually at least 1 percent for parent and family engagement activities. In accordance with federal regulations, at least 90% of that 1% is allocated to Title I schools, with priority given to high-need schools. The free and reduced lunch population count from Cycle Two of the prior school year is used to assist in the equitable distribution of funds to schools.

A survey will be developed to determine what subjects parents would like to know more about and the methods of involvement in which parents would participate. The survey will determine not only how money is spent but the targeted topics and guests we bring in to present.

Oakland Heights has many community partners:

- Counseling Associates--referrals for School-Based Mental Health
- Arkansas Tech University--Partnership with the education department to place Intern I students in almost every classroom to allow smaller adult to student ratios in the classrooms/Sorority and Fraternities provide food for food pantry
- Arkansas Tech Softball- provides Mentors/Lunch Buddys for OHE students
- · City Church--Support including volunteers, resources, and help to meet student and parent needs
- PTO--OHE has a PTO that meets monthly. Leaders will be opportunities to have a voice in decisions as appropriate
- River Valley Food for Kids--Provide backpacks of food for students who have food shortages at home--this includes school age students and pre-k students
- These programs will coordinate to support student success in school as well as promote effective parenting practices and participation in school activities
- OHE will coordinate with preschool programs to offer information regarding transition to kindergarten as well as information on registering students for kindergarten. Activities will include visits to preschools in town as well as Teddy Bear Picnic which introduces parents and students to kindergarten classrooms and teachers.
- This plan will be incorporated in the school improvement plan.

- Parents are provided a Family Kit that provides resources for parents including descriptions of curriculum programs, ways parents can support their student in school, etc.
- Parents are provided with ACT Aspire scores from their students' assessments and have an opportunity to discuss the results at P/T Conferences. In addition, parents of students in kindergarten through fourth grade will be given reports related to iStation and classroom report cards and teachers will explain the results of these assessments to parents.
- Parents are given a report twice a year that indicates whether their child is reading on or below grade level in reading.

- Parents may access extra resources in the classroom or through the Parent Center to support the achievement of their child at home.
- Parents of at-risk students in reading and math will be provided summer tutoring for 2-4 hours a week. In this time, they will also be given reading materials to promote continued reading during the months we are not in school.
- During the O'Down in October, parents are invited to attend the Read With Me Book Club and get a quality text to read with their child(ren), read aloud/comprehension set for the book, tips page for questioning with Themes on back, and a Reading Calendar to mark their progress.
- Parents receive the Parent Compact, Title I Letter and view a Title I Powerpoint presentation/video prior to September 1.
- OHE staff, Title I staff and Instructional staff will build a video for parents to view describing the role of Title I and how the money is used at Oakland Heights to support at-risk populations.

- Through our Family Kit and Report to Patrons, parents are given information about curriculum and on-line resources to help their child in school.
- At least twice a year parents attend a P/T Conference to discuss academic progress of their child. Parents are also provided documentation identifying whether their child is reading at/above grade level reading or below.
- Parents receive information from the state as well as from the school district describing the assessment data being used and how the results of that data can help the teacher better understand how to better address weaknesses in the child's academics.
- Provide professional development to staff to ensure two way communication is a priority and parents are equal partners in their child's education, to ensure parents feel welcome in the building, to respond to parent requests, and to value the contributions of parents
- Share results of parent feedback in surveys with the staff to identify strengths and weaknesses of parent involvement and ways to improve parent/school communication.
