A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Students, Staff, Parents/Guardians, and Community Members:

I hope this letter finds you refreshed, rejuvenated, and ready for a new year! Our dedicated staff are prepared to provide challenging and engaging learning opportunities for students in all grades. Our most important goal is that our students leave our schools ready to impact their community in a positive way, no matter where they are as adults.

Along with opportunities for students, Republic School District will also welcome new staff members into a new community, or just a new role for the 22-23 school year. Ryan Antos is our new English teacher for grades 8-12, as well as our new Head Football Coach. Theresa Finley's role changed to the 7-8 math teacher, 7th grade English teacher, and halftime assistant principal. Kristyn Gintz is our new half-time Academic Counselor. Katrina Sage is our half-time JH elective teacher. Armando Avila is a seasoned teacher who joins us as our 4th grade teacher. Scott Winters, also a seasoned teacher, joins us as our 5th grade teacher. Josh Zakar, whom you all may know, has moved into the role of our 6th grade teacher. Mike McRae will now be our Alternative Learning teacher. A new role for the district and Mr. McRae will be our outdoor adventure program. Mr. McRae has coined it "R.O.A.Rs" I will let Mr. McRae unveil the words behind the acronym, look for his report in this newsletter.

At the 7-12 grade levels, we have added a mid-morning break and extended transition times for students to get through the halls and to class assignments. Additionally, we worked on scheduling a few new electives to give students better choices, while still maintaining the highly requested courses like Choir and Band.

Cell phones:

While we concede that smart phones offer learning opportunities, we are one-to-one with Chromebooks in the 7-12 grades. Students will not need their smartphones with them during class time. We have purchased school combination locks for lockers. JR High and HS Students can rest assured that their phones will be safe, locked in their lockers. Cell phone use during class is largely away from academics and leads to distractions, and a possible drop in performance. This year, all students will be expected to leave their phones locked in their lockers during class time. This will help eliminate opportunities for students to take their phones with them when they leave the classroom during class time. We fully understand that sometimes students are simply using phones during that time to covertly meet up with friends, ultimately leading to a distraction from learning.

Students will be able to utilize their phones during a mid-morning breakfast at 8:50 and at their lunchtime. We ask that you speak to your student to help support our efforts with this "Zero Distraction" learning policy. Students who fail to comply with the policy will face disciplinary consequences consistent with expectations found in our Student Handbook.

Student Government:

We will begin the process of campaigning and elections the first week of school. This will include our Associated Student Body, as well as class officer nominations and elections.

Athletics:



ROARS REPORT

Republic Outdoor Adventure Rangers is off to a ROARing Start!

As part of Republic School District's vision to provide for our students the best education possible, we are implementing a new program called Republic Outdoor Adventure Rangers (R.O.A.Rs).

ROARs is an outdoor learning opportunity that allows us to incorporate strategic educational activities in an outdoor setting. Students will have the opportunity to learn subjects like science, social studies, and language arts as well as skills like team building, collaboration, critical thinking, and leadership in a learning environment outside the "brick and mortar" classroom. The learning will be built around field trips that are kinesthetic and engaging.

Mr. Zakar's 6th grade class enjoyed a day of hiking around Swan Lake while making observations of three different ecosystems that surround the lake. After eating lunch students learned how to use a compass to find cardinal directions and then completed a closed course. While completing the compass course, students improved their leadership and teamwork skills.

Mrs. Torzewski's Kindergarten and Mrs. Campbell's first grade class both got the opportunity to tour Sherman Creek Orchard to study and learn about a working orchard. The highlight of the trip was getting to make apple cider and of course petting Keemo, Sherman Creek's giant, lovable husky.

A big thank you goes out to all of the parent chaperones who have volunteered their time to accompany us on adventures. Parent volunteers are a key to the success of this program.
