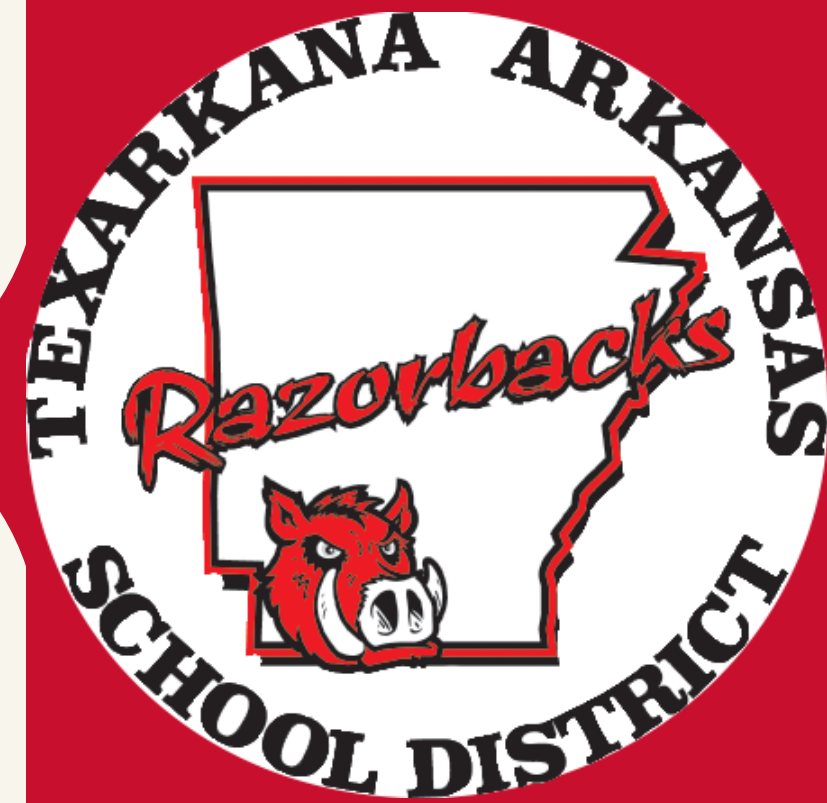
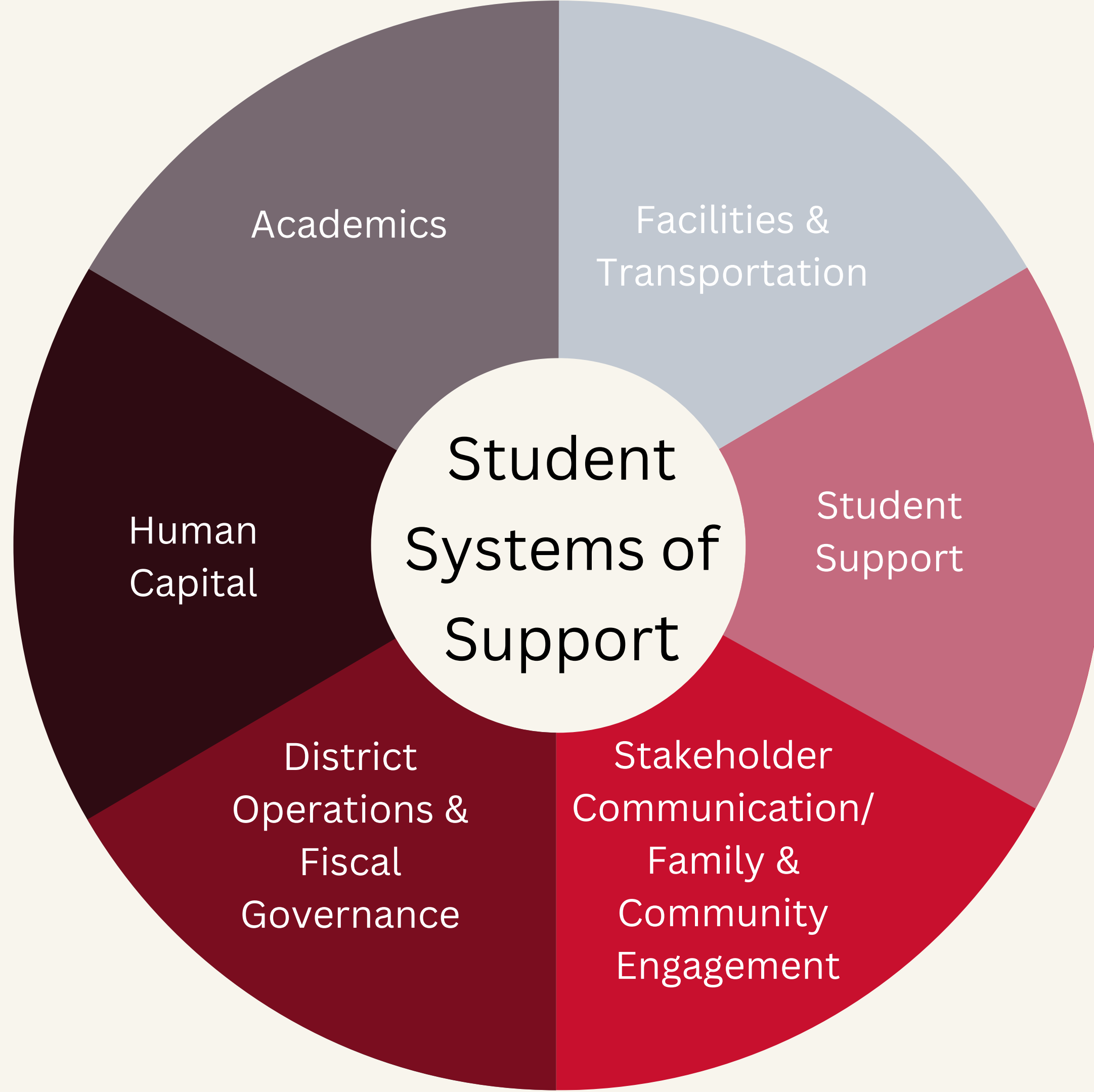



All Campuses

- The number of students reading on grade-level is up in a majority of the sub-groups
(Based on being Ready or Exceeds on the ACT Aspire).
- The weighted scores are up from 2021 (HLA and NHCS do not have scores to compare).
- 98.87% of K-12 students were tested.
- The K-8 students scoring Ready or Exceeding in Science is up in a majority of the sub-groups.

Celebrate the Highlights

- **Arkansas High School (9-12)**
 - Over 80% of 9th, 10th, and 11th graders are on time with credits to graduate.
 - AHS exceeds the state in earning Computer Science credits.
- **Arkansas Middle School (6-8)**
 - Exceeded the state in growth in Science achievement scores
 - Exceeded the state average in student engagement (attendance)
- **Fairview Elementary (K-5)**
 - Exceeded the state in growth in Science achievement scores
 - Recognized by the state as a School on the Move Toward Excellence for increasing weighted achievement by 10.46 points

Celebrate the Highlights

- **Harmony Leadership Academy (K-5)**
 - English Learners increased their achievement score average from 37.5 to 56.25.
 - The Special Education subgroup improved by 2.62 points.
- **Kilpatrick Elementary (K-5)**
 - Exceeded state average for points granted for school quality and student success
 - Every subgroup growth score improved.
- **Trice Elementary (K-5)**
 - Tested 100% of student population
 - Exceeded growth over state average in Science
- **North Heights Community School (K-6)**
 - Exceeded state average in all areas of the ESSA Index Score
 - Tested 100% of student population
