INDOOR AIR QUALITY

Henning Public Schools advocate a healthy school environment in which the surroundings contribute to an environment conducive to learning for students, and productivity for teachers and staff. To help accomplish this, we have implemented an IAQ Management Plan using guidelines provided by the Minnesota Department of Education, and the "Tools for Schools" document developed by U.S. EPA. Robert Brostrom is the IAQ Coordinator for the Henning Public Schools. He has been trained and certified by the Minnesota Department of Education to fulfill this position. ASBESTOS

In accordance with federal regulations, the Henning Public Schools have a management plan documenting the location and condition of all known or assumed asbestos containing materials (ACM) in the building. Every six months, an accredited inspector visually inspects the condition of the ACM. The condition of the ACBM was inspected and the school's maintenance procedures were reassessed.

The management plan is available for public inspection at the school office during normal business hours. Robert Brostrom is the designated person responsible for maintaining the asbestos management plans for the district. He can be reached at 218-583-2927.

NOTICE CONCERNING USE OF PEST CONTROL MATERIALS

A Minnesota state law went into effect in year 2000 that requires school to inform the parents and guardians if they apply certain pesticides on school property.

Specifically, this law requires school that apply these pesticides to maintain an estimated schedule of pesticide applications and to make the schedule available to parents and guardians for review or copying.

State law also requires that you be told that the long-term health effects on children from the application of such pesticides or the class of chemicals to which they belong maybe not be fully understood.

An estimated schedule of pesticide is available at the District Office. Parents of students may request to receive, at their expense, prior notification of pesticide applications made on days other than those specified in the estimated schedule (excluding emergency applications).
