



## **Summary of CAASPP Data**

However, I think it is important for us to remember that when analyzing this data, it is only one measure of what students know, and, more importantly, students took this assessment during a global pandemic!




### CAASPP Math 2020-2021 results indicates:


- 30% of third grade students scored exceeded or met standard in math
- 35% of fourth grade students scored exceeded or met standard in math
- 25% of fifth grade students scored exceeded or met standard in math




Summary: Eight percent of the 2020-2021 third grade cohort "exceeded standard" which is lower than the state average (the state average is in gray on the bar graph). However, 22% "met standard" which is only 1% below the state average.



Summary: Great job fourth grade team! They successfully exceeded the state average and previous year's scores in mathematics during a PANDEMIC!




Summary: Fifteen percent of fifth grade students "exceeded standard" which is the same as the state average and the 2018-2019 school year. Ten percent of students scored "met standard" which is only 4% below the state average.




### SBAC ELA results indicate:


- 34% of third grade students met or exceeded standards in ELA
- 36% of fourth grade students met or exceeded standards in ELA
- 43% of fifth grade students met or exceeded standards in ELA



Summary: Nine percent of the 2020-2021 third grade cohort "exceeded standard" in ELA which is 11% lower than the state average. However, 25% "met standard" which is 6% above the state average.



Summary: Twenty six percent of the 2020-2021 fourth grade cohort "exceeded standard" which is 5% above the state average and higher than any year since 2015.



Summary: Thirteen percent of the 2020-2021 fifth grade cohort "exceeded standard" which is 8% below the state average. However, 30% scored met standard which is 5% higher than the state average and more than any year since 2015. Nice job 5th grade!

Eight percent of students who attended Summer Academy spent a majority of the 2020–2021 school year on distance learning. They were identified by their DL teachers as needing to attend Summer Academy in order to be promoted to the next grade level. These students were assessed by Elaina

Stoll using Acadience at the end of the Summer Academy session. All but 2 (out of 14) of these students increased their NWF, ORF, Retell, and Maze scores at the end of Summer Academy when compared to their MOY Acadience scores.

Past DL students who were invited to attend Summer Academy due to lack of work completion, etc., and who did not attend, will be tested on August 10th to determine if the student should be promoted to the next grade level or retained.
