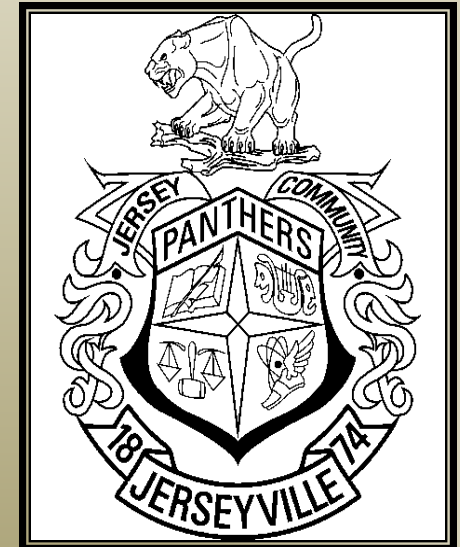

JCHS Profile

Community

The Jersey Community School District is in a rural community located approximately 50 miles northeast of St. Louis, MO. Area residents work in a mix of service industry, education, manufacturing, retail business, farming, & professional occupations. As a part of the St. Louis Metropolitan Area, the community has a large commuter population.

Jersey Community School District

Encompassing 331.91 square miles, School District #100 is the second largest school in area in the state. Last year the official district enrollment was 2,380 students attending one high school, one middle school, and three elementary schools. Transportation was provided for 2,147 students and 139 private school students. Busses operate on 49 routes and travel an average of 3,583 miles daily.

Jersey Community High School

JCHS is a public four-year comprehensive high school grades 8, 9, 10, 11, 12. The school is accredited by North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Illinois State Board of Education. The enrollment at JCHS is 1,025. The 191 day school year is divided into two semesters utilizing an 8 period scheduling format where each course meets for 48 minutes.

Faculty

There are 51 teachers, 1 librarian, 1 nurse, 1 social worker, 3 counselors and 3 administrators. 60% hold an advanced degree. The average total experience is 14 years.

Calculating GPA

Grades in Driver's Education and Physical Education Athletics are not used when calculating GPA. A base grade point average will be determined for each student by multiplying each semester grade by its value (A=5, B=4, C=3, D=2, F=0). Grade scale: A(100-90), B(89-80), C(79-70), D(69-60), F(59-0).

Beginning the 2013-2014 school year, honors classes will reflect an addition of 0.02 for all letter grades except F. There will be no deductions for Basic classes beginning the 2013-2014 school year.

Curriculum

Honors, advanced placement, and regular classes are offered in Business, English, Foreign Language, Science, Mathematics, Music, Social Studies, and Industrial Education.

Dual enrollment is available through Lewis & Clark Community College. Students who successfully complete these special grade level courses may receive college credit.
